#### From the Pastor's Pen:

"Where are we going?" "Are we there yet?" —These are questions that plague many a parent or traveler, especially when it involves children. But the same questions can be asked of the church, especially the one, "Where are we going?" We must answer this question before we can even entertain the second. We need to know where we are going in order to know when or if we get there. If we have no idea where we are going, how will we ever know if we get there?

Churches that are successful understand the importance of knowing where they are going, of having a vision, a vision that is led by the Spirit rather than by human interests. These churches leverage this vision to develop ministries that feed into this vision, that support it, and help it reach its fullest potential. Anything that does not point to this vision is set aside, not because it is not worthy, but that it can detract from the vision and tie up valuable resources that will be needed for the vision. While this may seem harsh, it is the only way to remain focused on the

vision, on the direction the church is going.

One thing I have learned is that I cannot be everything to everybody and church is the same. There is no way we can be everything to everybody, it is just not possible. We would run ourselves ragged and not do anything particularly well. Our vision would become cloudy and blurred causing us to make decisions that adversely affect our ministries and our direction as a church. We start to fracture as we try to jump into the next "hot" ministry or activity because we want to keep up with the "Joneses." We must understand that we are not like other churches, and they are not like us. Each body of believers have their own sets of talents, of gifts, and resources that they bring to the table in service to their vision. Each one offers something a little different, providing a unique service or ministry, and each adds to the whole building a more vibrant and fruitful universal church.

We are all involved in the same mission, to spread the Word of God, to make disciples, and to share the love of God with all we see. And we all have a part to play in that, but to play our part we need to have a vision, a focus— something that we can do and do well.

And the way to understand what vision to focus on, we need to ask God. We need to pray seeking God's will for this church. We need to hit our knees and ask God what it is that God wants us to do, and we need to be open to whatever response God gives us. It does us no good if we short-circuit this by putting restrictions or caveats on this request with things like, "Lord, you know we are old and there is not much more we can do, so don't ask much of me." Or "Lord, we have tried this before and it didn't work, why try it again?" If we sincerely seek God's will, God will provide us with the vision that

not only works for this church but brings glory to God.

Over these next few weeks, I ask you to join me in prayer seeking God's will to be revealed to us guiding us to who God wants us to be and what God wants us to do.

And once we know where we are going, then we can ask the next question, when will we get there. I look forward to asking that second question.





# Disciples Making Disciples Sharing the Good News in Our World Today

There are three core competencies that determine if we are ready to be a disciple and to make other disciples. They are the three "Greats;" The Great Confession, the Great Commandment, and the Great Commission.

In Matthew 16 we find the Great Confession. Jesus asks his disciples who they say he is and the everimpetuous Peter says, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." (v16). So the question is how does a person know if he or she has made the Great Confession in earnest? How does one know the difference between head knowledge and heart change? How do I know if the person I am discipling has taken this step?

The key indicator of knowing if we are ready to move forward in our spiritual walk centers around how we deal with the Word of God. In John 8:31 Jesus says, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine." To be a disciple of Jesus, Jesus expects us to

"abide in" or "dwell in" the Scriptures. According to Jesus, the proof of my identity as a disciple is that I "live by the book." If I am going to invest in the discipling process of someone else's life, then I will need to train that person to come alive to the Scriptures.

This hunger for the Scriptures does not have to be a two-hour Bible study or a three-sermon-podcast-per-day. However, there should be a hunger to grow in a relationship with one's Savior and Lord. The bottom line is that for a disciple, Scripture should be a significant part of his or her daily life. If a person has a desire for and competency in God's Word, then they should be ready to take the next step: the Great Commandment.
