





Disciples Making Disciples Sharing the Good News in Our World Today

A lawyer was examining Jesus, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment of the law?" (Matthew 22:34). It was supposed to be a setup to discredit Jesus, but turned into a directive that leads every disciple of Jesus into a life of blessings. Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." (v37) and, he added, "you shall love your neighbor as yourself."
