#### From the Pastor's Pen:

recently took out a dollar bill to pay for something and as I handed it over to the clerk my eyes caught these words written on the back of the bill, "In God we trust." Simple words but loaded with meaning and purpose. To say, "In God we trust," means to say we believe in God's promise to be present throughout our earthly lives, to believe that God's love for us is steadfast and true and to believe that God has our best interests at heart, even if difficulty and sometimes catastrophic events occur in our lives. Trusting in God means we don't rely on our own understanding as much as we rely on God's wisdom and guidance, as illustrated in Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

This kind of trust means engaging God, seeking wisdom and direction even if we think we know the way to go, because quite often things are not as they seem. What we may think is a good choice can turn out to be disastrous, while one we think would be troubling actually works out better.

Remember these words from Jeremiah 29:11, "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans for your welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and hope."

I know there are times when we doubt this, especially when dealing with troubling times and circumstances, but it is especially important during these times that our trust in God should be at its highest, for God uses these times to transform and strengthen us, molding us into a people who not only endure, but overcome. But it can only happen if we put our trust in God and truly believe that God is present, working to help us through whatever we are facing.

Deuteronomy 31:8 reminds us, "It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will never leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed."

The Lord is with us and will always be with us. This gives us confidence and trust that no matter where we go or what happens, our Lord will be there offering guidance, support,

comfort, and love.

It all comes back to love, doesn't it? Love is what binds us together with each other and with our God. It is this love that God shows us, a love so great it led to one of the most tragic and yet wonderful moments in all of history. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life," John 3:16.

If ever there was a moment to fully understand the love God has for us, this is it. If ever there was a moment to truly believe in God's promises to recover a lost people, this is it. If ever there was a moment to trust in God as our creator, sustainer, and redeemer, this is it. # Disciples Making Disciples Sharing the Good News in Our World Today

#### A Matter of Focus

If we are to be disciples making disciples then the focus of our faith walk should be outward not inward. Jesus came to earth to be a living example of the love of God and show us the way to God. After Jesus comes the Holy Spirit as a "helper" for us along this way. The third essential part of this journey is the church which exists to come along beside people on this way and help them in their journey. If a church is not focused on making disciples and teaching them all that Jesus has taught, then they are not being the church God intends (see the Great Commission.) All Christians have the potential to fulfill the Great Commission to go and the Great Commandment to love but sometimes our focus needs to be re-aimed. Today, I am going to include a quote from John Piper in "Consider Each Other How to Stir Up Love" to help us re-focus:

Here is the focus for your life. Here is what you aim at from morning till night as a Christian. Notice carefully: It is not what you might expect. It is not: consider how to love each other and do good deeds. That would be biblical and right. But it's different: "Consider how to stimulate each other to love and good deeds." Focus on helping others become loving people. Aim at stirring up others to do good deeds. And of course the implication would also be that if others need help and stirring up, we do too, and so we would be aiming at what sorts of ways we can think and feel and talk and act that will stir each other up to love and do good deeds. The aim of our lives is not just loving and doing good deeds, but helping to stir up others to love and to do good deeds.
