Christ at Heart's Door—"Behold, I stand at the door and knock" Revelation 3:20

The fifth window on the right was planned by Lloyd Clanton, only son of T. C. Clanton, in honor of his father. Lloyd died shortly after the window's installation in 1950, and Mrs. Clanton asked that the window be regarded as a memorial to father and son. This beautiful stained glass rendition of Holman Hunt's "Christ Standing at Heart's Door is a favorite of many members as Christ holds the lantern signifying the "Light of the World." The door must be opened from the inside (our hearts) as there is no latch or handle on the outside. The quote is completed: "If any man will hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him and he with me."


