

A Word from Pastor Libby

Friends,

Paul writes in Romans 7:15-20 (CEB), "I don't know what I'm doing, because I don't do what I want to do. Instead, I do the thing that I hate. But if I'm doing the thing that I don't want to do, I'm agreeing that the Law is right. But now I'm not the one doing it anymore. Instead, it's sin that lives in me. I know that good



doesn't live in me—that is, in my body. The desire to do good is inside of me, but I can't do it. I don't do the good that I want to do, but I do the evil that I don't want to do. But if I do the very thing that I don't want to do, then I'm not the one doing it anymore. Instead, it is sin that lives in me that is doing it." This has led to much contemplation and discernment about the self. Thomas Merton famously wrote about the "True Self" and the "False Self," which has been the basis of much discussion as people in general have affirmed his understanding. His belief is that the "False Self" is the life we live on earth and the "True Self" is who we "really" are as disciples of Christ. I understand his desire to help people understand what it means to be transformed. I have preached on the "True Self."

As I have been preaching on the doubts you have shared, I realize that I have doubts about the way we try to explain transformation and if the language we use is helpful. There are some points it might be helpful, like if a person is just starting some type of recovery and it is seen as moving to wholeness. Though it is not helpful if someone has worked on discernment or has come through trauma and has come to love who they are, then hear from the church that this self I have come to know, and love is a "False Self." It can cause a person to believe they aren't really welcome in the church. It can also cause them to wonder how the person they know themselves to be can be "false." In that sense we are denying their agency.

I think Paul comes closer to understanding how to live our faith and be faithful with what he writes in Romans 12:1-2 (The Message) "So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-towork, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so welladjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and guickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity. God brings the best out of you. develops well-formed maturity in you." The challenge here is that we must normalize change for ourselves and our communities because God works to bring change that is seen in transformation. Not denying ourselves, but to focus on living fully with God. I wonder if we shouldn't cast aside the "False Self" language and focus on more encouraging and positive language. What if we described our earthly, human self as the "True Self" and our transformed Godly eternal selves as "Our Holy Self." This would honor the understanding of self as humans and at the same time leave room for transformation to grow into our eternal life that has already begun and that continues through salvation and resurrection. Then new people to the church would be welcomed with honor for who they are, yet to also bring them on the journey of transformation with the rest of the community.

Backpack Giveaway




