A Word from Pastor Libby

Friends,

In this Christmas Season, yes, we are in it right now the twelve days from Christmas to Epiphany, I have spent time reflecting on the many things that have occurred in the past year and I give great thanks beyond the birth of our savior Jesus. Not only have



I been serving at Church of the Cross and seen our spiritual growth and development of our inclusivity statement I am now also in ministry with the people at Roxbury United Parish. I enjoy getting to know the people and their ministries and all those who they impact as well.

I give thanks to all the people who came to my open house, sent me cards, shared their gifts in the form of homemade presents, and who gifted me with other wonderful presents, all of which were icing on the cake of being present with you all in ministry this year. I am thankful for our church leaders and staff who help us to continue to seek God's presence and to live God's will for us as we live into the abundance we possess to live into and out our ministries in these places.

From all this work together, I realize that I need to spend more time with God and focusing on what I must do to live out the calling God has on my life as a disciple and leader. Over the last several months, and especially the last few months, I have been refining what it means for me to be in ministry and to be a leader in this time and in these places as I prepare for further exploration in the coming year. As I have been discerning, listening, and learning I have found myself focusing on the word "intention." This is not the word I got as a star word last year, which was generosity. Rather it is the word that has come out of focusing on generosity and realizing I could be more generous in some aspects of my life and ministry particularly with truly living out my calling for justice and peace, not minimizing it because so many injustices do not directly affect my life.

I have been very intentional in planning out what I intend to do in the coming year. These are not resolutions, things I will do come hell or high water, but things I will do and adapt as I continue to focus on God's direction and will for my life. My first intention is to listen and follow God's will with boldness and grace. Thus, I have focused on the word intention more aptly fits my desire. Intention means "an aim or a plan." Except in the medical field, it means "the process of healing a wound." Both definitions fit what I think is necessary for me to draw closer to God in the coming year. As Bryant McGill says in Voice of Reason, "Every journey begins with the first step of articulating the intention, and then becoming the intention." Becoming is my hope for this year.

Part of my intention is to take Renewal Leave during 2024 that allows me to have more extended time away to explore more deeply my calling to engage further in justice and peace initiatives. I am receiving two four-week periods with a week of vacation attached for this exploration. One will be from April 29-June 1 and the other from September 11 -October 16.



VANCO makes giving to COC easier than ever!

Visit www.coc-salina.org and click on "Give your offering to Church of the Cross by clicking here." This will allow you to either give through a recurring payment or a one-time payment.

If you are currently signed up for a recurring payment you are able to edit your information by going to that same link and clicking login in the upper right corner. Then click on Payment Methods on the left side. You are also able to see the history of payments you have made to Church of the Cross through the VANCO system.

- Canned vegetables
- Crackers
- Grab and go snacks
- Macaroni and cheese.

Mental Health Training Opportunities

NAMI, the National Alliance on Mental Illness, is the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness.

NAMI is a non-profit organization that provides <u>free</u> education, support and advocacy for those persons and their families who are impacted by a mental health disorder.

All NAMI trained family program leaders are family members with a loved one living with mental illness; i.e., depression, anxiety, bipolar, schizophrenia, borderline personality disorder, OCD, PTSD.

We recognize the challenges facing families to find and receive mental health education and care for their loved ones. NAMI class curriculum is all evidence based and updated.

Our virtual class offerings scheduled for Spring 2024 include: NAMI Family to Family, NAMI Basics, NAMI Homefront,

- NAMI Family to Family class is a <u>free</u> virtual eight week class for family members, significant others and friends of people with mental health conditions. It facilitates a better understanding of mental health conditions, increases coping skills and empowers participants to become advocates for their loved one. Family members who have taken this course report it was life-changing for them in the education they received to better understand their loved one, how to best be their advocate, and how to communicate more effectively, and how to establish healthy boundaries.
- NAMI Basics is a six week class for parents, guardians and other family caregivers who provide care for youth (age 22 or younger) who are experiencing mental health symptoms.
- NAMI Homefront is a six week virtual class for families, caregivers and friends of military service members and veterans with mental health conditions. The course is designed specifically to help these families understand those challenges and improve their ability to support their service member or veteran.

Virtual classes are capped at 20 persons with any additional registrants being placed on a waitlist.
