A Word from Pastor Libby

Friends,

Today as I sit here thinking about what a change the weather has taken over the last few weeks; I wonder if we ourselves are prepared for such a transformation as we move through new seasons of faith. Are we aware of the ways God is gifting us in a direction of growth in faith or do we remain comfortable in the place we have been. I think this is important as we enter the seasons of giving thanks and sharing gifts.



What has God offered us that we can truly be thankful for? Is it a loving spouse, family, children? Is it a comfortable home and food to eat? Is it something much more substantial like working a dream job where we can use the gifts that give us great joy? What would it be like to name one a day or even to make it part of your family gatherings to share what gifts you have received from God. This is an essential part of fully engaging our current worship series "Gifts of Love" that will continue until Advent which we will start on November 26.

As we move into Advent, we will begin a new worship series called "The Gift of Being Present" as we consider the many ways, we have been gifted by one another. How is God calling us to gift our communities with presence to build up the kin-dom of God? Kin-dom has a different understanding yet direct link to kingdom. Kin-dom, for some, means the reality of God's power moving in and through us, bringing liberation and opening spaces where love invites us into deep kinship with one another. The focus here is on growing deeply in interpersonal relationships in our community to strengthened the body of Christ. What better time for us to build up the kin-dom than when we gather around the Thanksgiving Table with family and friends or as we gather throughout the Christmas season to bake, shop, decorate, and gather for meals or just time together. What if we were intentional about noticing God's presence in all these things we do and then sharing what we notice with those who we are with? It is a wonderful opportunity to naturally witness to our faith and to share the gift of Jesus Christ with others as we strengthen our bonds with the love of God. When we focus on the Kin-dom we remove the focus on one over, to the shared ministry of Emmanuel, God with us.

Paul talks about this kin-dom work in 2 Corinthians 2:14-17, "In the Messiah, in Christ, God leads us from place to place in one perpetual victory parade. Through us, he brings knowledge of Christ. Everywhere we go, people breathe in the exquisite fragrance. Because of Christ, we give off a sweet scent rising to God, which is recognized by those on the way of salvation—an aroma redolent with life.

But those on the way to destruction treat us more like the stench from a rotting corpse.

This is a terrific responsibility. Is anyone competent to take it on? No—but at least we don't take God's Word, water it down, and then take it to the streets to sell it cheap. We stand in Christ's presence when we speak; God looks us in the face. We get what we say straight from God and say it as honestly as we can." (The Message)

I am excited about the opportunities we have to share the gift of God through the presence of Jesus Christ, as we deepen our connections with one another and our communities. We are drawing near to a new season that will find its ending in the beginning of a new year.

Gifts of Love – a series on stewardship

Intentional giving is intentional discipleship.

This month you will have the opportunity to hear and learn more about biblical teachings on giving as you plan for your financial giving for 2024 year and beyond.

On Sunday, November 4, we are privileged to host the Rev. Dustin Petz, President of the Kansas United Methodist Foundation. In his presentation, "Giving Generously & Leaving a Legacy," Rev. Dr. Dustin Petz will focus on giving now and estate planning. Petz will share ways to maximize your giving during life, and provide general information about estate planning and considerations for charitable giving through an estate to support the church and ministry.
