CHILDREN'S ROOM



TRINITY SUNDAY



Christian Symbolism This is an ancient symbol for the Trinity. The center circle reads *Deus*, Latin for God. The three outer circles contain abbreviations. The P is for *Pater*, Latin for Father. The F is for *Filius*, Latin for Son. The SS stands for *Sancti Spiritus*, Latin for Holy Spirit. The outside arms, connecting the three outer circles, all read *non est*, literally "is not." The center arms, connecting each outer circle to the center circle, reads *est*, "is."

Thus, this simple diagram depicts one entity. The Father is God. The Son is God. The Spirit is God. But the Father is not the Son. The Son is not the Spirit. The Spirit is not the Father. It is as good a diagram for the Trinity as one will find in the history of the church.

OPENING SONG: Praise to the Lord, the Almighty (CW 234:1, 3, 5)

Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation!

M: In the name of God the Holy Spirit, who called us by the gospel and brought us to believe in Jesus Christ as our Savior:

C: Alleluia!

CONFESSION OF SINS

M: Let us confess our sins to our Triune God and ask for his forgiveness:

C: Almighty God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—

I confess to you that I have not loved you with all my heart.

In what I have done and left undone,

I have pursued my ways instead of your ways.

I have not loved my brothers and sisters as myself.

For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

I am truly sorry for my sins.

I repent of them.

Heavenly Father, I beg for your mercy.

Gracious Lord Jesus, cleanse me from my sins through your suffering and death.

O Holy Spirit, grant me the strength to amend my sinful life and live for you alone.

ABSOLUTION

M: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins.

By the perfect life and innocent death of his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ,

he has removed your guilt forever.

You are his own dear child.

May the Holy Spirit give you strength to live according to his will.

C: Amen.

M: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

GOSPEL READING: John 16:12-15

The Son receives what he has from the Father. The Spirit receives what he has from the Son. We receive what we have from the Spirit.

¹² "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. ¹³ But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. ¹⁵ All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you."

SERMON: Romans 5:1-5

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵ And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

The Athanasian Creed This creed is named after St. Athanasius, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the fourth century. It was prepared to assist the Church in combating two errors that undermined Bible teaching. One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus Christ is true God and true man in one person. The Athanasian Creed continues to serve the Christian Church as a standard of the truth. It declares that whoever rejects the doctrine of the Trinity and the doctrine of Christ is without saving faith.

The section of the Athanasian Creed included here is the portion that confesses the Bible's teaching about the Triune God. This portion serves as a very fitting confession of faith for Trinity Sunday. A translation of the entire text of the Athanasian Creed may be found on pages 132-133 in *Christian Worship: A Lutheran Hymnal.*

CONFESSION OF FAITH: First Section of the Athanasian Creed

Minister: Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith. Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.

All: Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, Without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being. For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

Men: What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; The Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; The Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal; yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

Minister: In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty;

yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.

Women: So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God.
So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.
For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord.

so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.

All: The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone.
The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone.
The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten,
but proceeds from the Father and the Son.
So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons;
one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior,
But all three persons are coequal and coeternal,

so that, in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshipped as one God, and one God worshipped as three persons.

All: Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

M: Triune God, you are the one eternal God, whose name we praise forever. We could not have known you, our only Savior, if you had not revealed yourself to us as Father, Son, and Spirit—three persons, yet one God. Remove from us all unbelief, and grant us humble faith as we contemplate this high and holy mystery.

C: Scatter all those who are wise in their own conceits, and give us a simple, childlike trust to worship you as Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity.

M: God our Father, whatever good is in us, whatever good things we have, and whatever good we do comes from you alone. In you we live and move and have our being.

C: Open our eyes to see the gifts you shower down on us daily—purely out of your own fatherly love and care.

M: Lord Jesus our Savior, you came into our world to make the Father known to us; you joined yourself to us by taking on our humanity; you brought us back to God by shedding your blood. In love you walked the way of suffering and bore alone the wrath of God, the wrath that we deserved for our sins.

C: Help us believe that all you did, all you suffered, and all you endured, you did to rescue us and set us free.

M: Creator Spirit, you have opened our eyes by the bright light of your Word; you have burst through our deafness with the clear sound of your voice in the Scriptures; you have breathed into us new life by the power of the gospel. Through Word and Sacrament, help us grow in understanding how wide and high and deep is the love of God.

C: Make us firm in our resolve to do battle with our sin. In every weakness be our strength, that we may show ourselves to be God's true children.

M: Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions.

Silent prayer

M: O Holy Trinity, you are the God of glory, the God of grace, the God of every comfort. From you and through you and to you are all things. We rejoice to call you Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and so to praise your holy name forever.

We join to pray the prayer Christ taught us:

LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

Serve the Lord with gladness.


