

***About Our Fair***

*At our fair, you can give a donation or buy a holiday gift in memory or honor of your family or friends. All proceeds go to further the missions of the following participating nonprofit organizations. Items for sale include handicrafts made here and abroad, quality kitchen knives, jewelry, pecans, note cards, stuffed animals, and handcrafted flame and cross sculptures. Each organization will either acknowledge your gift or provide a card that you may send to your recipient.*

**The Campus Kitchen of W&M**

Through its Campus Kitchen, William and Mary students use existing food resources to make meals for local public housing neighborhoods in Williamsburg.

**Dream Shop of Eastern State**

The Dream Shop of Eastern State Hospital is a Fair Trade organization, run by resident volunteers. Its resident volunteers sell handicrafts made by cooperatives in Guatemala and Africa. 90 percent of the proceeds are returned to the cooperatives that spend it on community projects related to education, housing, nutrition, clean water, and medical care.

**Early Childhood Music School**

This school housed in our church provides quality music education to over 400 children in the greater Williamsburg area. Donations enable scholarships for children from financially challenged families.

**Faith in Action**

Faith in Action enables seniors and adults with illnesses or disabilities to remain in their homes by transporting them to doctors' appointments and shopping venues and by providing respite care, social visits, and reassuring phone calls.

**FISH**

FISH is an all-volunteer organization that helps needy residents of the greater Williamsburg area. FISH depends entirely on a caring community for food, clothing, volunteers, and financial donations to support its neighbors in need.

**Friends of Barnabas**

Friends of Barnabas provides high quality sustainable health care to impoverished Honduran children and moves communities toward self-sufficiency through health education.

**Heart Havens**

Heart Havens operates 11 group homes in Virginia for adults with developmental disabilities. Its homes provide a safe and nurturing environment for the residents.

**Heifer International**

Heifer promotes self-reliance by providing livestock and training to poor families worldwide. Recipients obtain food and income from the sale of the animals' milk, eggs, and honey. The first offspring is shared with another family, which multiplies the impact.

**Hospice House & Support Care**

Hospice House and Support Care provides care and support to individuals at the end of life. Care is given to individuals and their families in their homes or at the Hospice House facility in Williamsburg.

**Immigrant Neighbor Advent  
Wreath**

In cooperation with members of St. Stephens Lutheran Church, our church members will have an opportunity to share the hope of Christmas with immigrant families in Williamsburg who have endured significant hardship this year. Stop by the table, pick a leaf from the wreath, and purchase a gift for the Williamsburg neighbor you have drawn.

## **Jeremiah Project**

The Jeremiah Project provides short-term mission opportunities for middle school students. This project makes homes warmer, safer, drier, and more accessible for God's people.

## **Kids Morning Out**

KMO is a weekday ministry of our church that provides a safe and enriching environment for children ages 1 to 2-1/2. Donations will go towards scholarships and classroom materials.

## **Lackey Clinic**

This nonprofit clinic provides skilled, compassionate care to the medically disadvantaged in Williamsburg, James City County, Yorktown, Newport News, and Poquoson. The clinic meets medical and dental needs of those who would otherwise go without.

## **Latvia Hope Center**

Hope Center, a project of the Latvian United Methodist Church, serves unwed, teenage mothers in homes around the country. The Center gives medical and spiritual care as well as training to mothers before and after the birth of their child.

## **Literacy for Life**

Literacy for Life improves lives by teaching adults literacy skills required for self-sufficiency, better health, and meaningful participation in society.

## **Local Outreach Ministries**

This arm of Williamsburg UMC reaches out to assist a variety of community service ministries and local outreach programs.

## **Peninsula Pastoral Counseling**

This counseling center provides professional counseling and consultation within a faith context. Its counselors guide people toward wholeness and health and serve all who can benefit regardless of religious beliefs.

## **Respite Care of Williamsburg**

Respite Care offers a safe and stimulating social program for special needs seniors while providing a "gift of time" for their families. Caregivers benefit from support groups, social activities, and educational programs.

## **Rise Against Hunger**

Formerly known as Stop Hunger Now, this organization recruits local volunteers to package thousands of meals and then distributes them to some of the world's most vulnerable people worldwide.

## **Seraj Library Project**

Seraj develops libraries for children in rural Palestine, supports five Mar Elias schools in Israel, and promotes interfaith peacemaking efforts.

## **SERRV**

SERRV promotes economic progress in developing countries by marketing the products of artisans and farmers. Proceeds help workers improve skills, earn a fair income, and send their children to school. SERRV also supports vital community projects such as water wells and medical clinics.

## **Society of St. Andrew**

This society works with faith groups, secular groups, schools, and individuals to feed hungry people nationwide. Volunteers glean potatoes and other vegetables from farmers' fields to support various feeding programs.

## **Tent of Nations**

Supported by the Wesley Foundation, TON is a peace and reconciliation center located on a 100-acre farm near Bethlehem. Surrounded by Israeli settlements and the Palestinian village of Nahalin, the center seeks to build bridges of understanding and achieve reconciliation among all people of the land.

## **United Methodist Women**

Williamsburg United Methodist Women and its circles raise funds for local and global outreach programs. They will be selling both Methodist jewelry and quality kitchen knives to support these outreach activities.

## **Wesley Community Service Ctr**

This center provides services such as after school and summer enrichment programs to the children of disadvantaged families. It also assists these families during the holidays and implements a meals on wheels program.

## **Wesley Foundation**

Wesley Foundation is the United Methodist Church's campus ministry at William & Mary. Members support social justice causes and participate in local and global outreach projects.

## Williamsburg House of Mercy

St. Bede's outreach center works with other faith communities to comprehensively meet the needs of those in Williamsburg who struggle with poverty and homelessness. The center provides food, transportation, financial, and housing assistance and arranges access to medical and mental health services.

## Youth Ministry

Williamsburg United Methodist youth are actively involved in local outreach activities and summer mission projects. Your donation will help them gain experiences that will enable them to both help others and personally grow in their faith.

## ARC of Greater Williamsburg

Proudly serves adults with disabilities through programs and transportation for fitness, arts and culture, social and education, life skills training and internships for future employment.


