

October 23 Fire Drill Grade C-

The WUMC Trustees would like to thank everyone who participated in the October 23rd fire drill. For the most part the fire drill was successful and fire department personnel present were impressed with the organization and speed which the Sanctuary was evacuated. However, they noticed a few individuals in each service ignored the fire evacuation plan and when reminded by ushers intentionally refused to follow the planned escape route. Several church members setting up for Sunday School in the basement ignored the fire alarm and stayed in the building. We hold fire drills only once or twice a year to practice what will be done should a real emergency occur. Individuals who don't follow the plan in a real emergency place themselves, their fellow church members, and fire fighters at risk. It is important that we all take them seriously – fire department personnel certainly do.

Thanksgiving Ministry



About That Time...Thanksgiving Day is only a month away! This year our church will again partner with Meals on Wheels to prepare 125 individual dinners. Some of the meals will go to neighbors in need who live in the Grove community. Others will be delivered to individuals housed in local motels without cooking facilities.

On the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, a team of church volunteers are needed to help package the meals, both at Meals on Wheels and in the Fellowship Hall at WUMC. On Thanksgiving morning a few volunteers are needed to ready the hot meals for delivery. Prior to the holiday, groups

within the church will make placemats and Christmas ornaments for our Thanksgiving meals and will assemble toiletry kits to be used for the Winter Shelter Ministry.

We also appreciate donations to help us fund this ministry. It costs approximately \$15 to purchase the components of each meal and the supplies for the gifts we provide to the community. Any extra food will be given to a community food program and unused funds will be donated to a local food distribution center.
