

We welcome again today guest preacher Joseph Pilmore, the first official missionary from John Wesley to reach Williamsburg. Mr. Pilmore arrived on Saturday, August 22, 1772 after landing at Jamestown, for the purpose of launching Methodist "Societies" here in America's colonial capital. Considered by many to be one of the most able preachers among John Wesley's representatives to America, Joseph was born in Fadmoor, England in 1739, and educated at Wesley's Kingswood School at Bristol. He served for several years as an itinerant lay preacher in Cornwall, Ireland and Wales before stepping forward to serve in America. (For those interested, a reprint of our August 2022 Messenger, outlining how Pilmore arrived in Williamsburg and how he ministered here, can be found on the table and in the rack by the banner exit door.) We are appreciative of the considerable risks Joseph took to make his first visit to our town, two and a half centuries ago and for the legacy of faith-pioneers like him!




