On the Cover: for his "The Census at Bethlehem," Pieter Bruegel depicted yet another Bible story as a contemporary event – in this case, set in a mid-16th century Flemish village. Close inspection reveals children playing on the ice and throwing snowballs. Men drink at a makeshift bar, while a census-taker processes a crowd by an inn. At right foreground stands a shadowed man beside a small hut, holding a clapper (used at the time by those with leprosy to warn away others). A begging bowl sits in the mud by his door.

And among them, seemingly unnoticed, Joseph leads a small donkey with Mary astride it, who alone regards the viewer as if she were pondering something.
