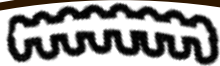

I'd like to share the story of Namaan in 2 Kings 5. Namaan was a great man and successful commander of the army of Aram. Unfortunately, he contracted a skin disease that greatly afflicted him and no cure could be found. During one of his raids he captured a young girl from Israel who served Namaan's wife. She said that if he would just go to Samaria to see the prophet Elisha he could be healed, so he left immediately to seek out this healing.

When Namaan arrived Elisha sent a messenger out to tell him to do one thing: Go wash in the Jordan seven times. Now just imagine if you were Namaan, a very important man in your country. You've travelled from a far land to see this man, whom you were told was your last hope for healing, and he doesn't even have the courtesy to come and see you. Instead, he sends a messenger out to tell you to bathe in some dirty old river when you have clean rivers at home to bathe in. You'd be upset too! However, his servant pointed out that if Elisha had asked him to do some great and difficult thing Namaan would have done it, yet he would not do this simple task? Namaan realized the servant was right, went to the river and was healed.

In our lives, we expect God to do great and majestic things to bring healing. Yet, God often works in the simple ways. He has always been on display, waiting for his people to turn toward him. All we have to do is turn, for Jesus has done all the rest.
