January sermon series... In the Dust of the Rabbi – what does it look like to be a follower of Jesus?

During Jesus' ministry, He started by urging people to "come and see." Next He asked them to commit to follow Him "follow Me...." But then Jesus slowly turned up the heat. He began adding qualifiers, statements that start with "You're my disciple if":

You love one another (John 13:35)

You abide in His Word (John 8:31)

You deny yourself (Matthew 16:24)

You make Jesus your prime allegiance (Luke 14:26)

Eventually, Jesus took it a step further and said that a person had to "come and die" (Luke 14:27) to be a disciple.

But Jesus didn't start with "come and die." He moved people slowly from "come and see" to "come and die."
