PRAISE:

Pray the refugees we have met recently, or known for many years, would move closer to trust in Jesus as they hear the stories of Him and His love for them.
- As Jan leads weekly Bible studies with teenagers in the juvenile detention lock-up, pray the youth will follow the Holy Spirit's direction to learn the Word and see change in their lives. Also pray for the ladies serving the last six months of their sentences at Redemption House (where Jan helps lead Bible studies), that they will surrender to Jesus and embrace the Word of God to deeply change their lives.
- Jan also teaches English at the International House to refugee and immigrant women. Many are M'lims. Pray the Lord's love through Christian volunteers will influence them, changing the way they view what following Jesus means, and sharing with their families.
- A young Christian Chin (Burmese) husband and father of five is on dialysis, facing a possible kidney transplant. Eldon has been asked to help him manage the transplant work-up process, requiring attention to details while working through language and cultural challenges. Pray things will go smoothly and for protection of his health in the process.
