As we move into October, our first-ever TLC Home Build in Tijuana, Mexico, is just around the corner—set for the weekend of November 22–23. 2025.

Whether you want to join the build team or support the project financially, your participation will help provide a safe, secure home for a family in need—just 40 minutes across the border.

It's a unique opportunity to serve with our hands and hearts while sharing the love of Christ in a very real and tangible way.

What to Expect:

The project will take place over two days, and no building experience is required. We'll meet early Saturday morning at the church and caravan to the build site in Tijuana. We'll work alongside the family to build everything from the walls to the roof, windows, painting, and more. All tools and materials are provided, and safe overnight lodging is included.


Our October meetings will be the 4th and 18th. Please join us as the Spirit moves you.

Every coupon taken means a local military family will receive a Commissary gift card for the main dish of their choice and a food package with the fixings for a holiday meal. As we begin to think about our family and friends and all we are blessed with in our community, please remember these families, many very far from their home, and help make their Thanksgiving holiday a little brighter.

Facilities Corner Report

Thankfully we are finally through our yearly battle with weeds and enjoy the respite until next Spring. With key members of the maintenance team not available due health issues or vacations, actual maintenance accomplishments were minimal. This was also impacted by a low turnout for the Chain Gang with only 5 members being able to make the September workday. Work completed included servicing the two mini-splits to address issues found in last month's semiannual PMS, doing repairs on the fellowship hall door crash bar, and the Chain Gang's trimming of the oleanders behind the church building and those between the east lawn and mulched area, and the trimming the lower portions of the pine trees east of the youth build (some branches extended over the play area and could be potential be consider a safety issue). As to landscaping, Randy continues his stellar work on the lawn and brown/yellowish spots in the lawns, that is his efforts to rid the lawns of weeds and hopefully fill-in with new grass growth with the help of the fertilization he has done. He has also put in new soil and Spanish Lavendar in the columbarium planters.


Other maintenance efforts included trying to get the city to address the acacia and trees to the west of the parking lot/preschool due to it being a fire hazard and to trim the trees along the canyon that could be a safety issue to the Giving Garden. We are still in discussions with the 7th Day Adventist regarding a joint effect to redo the entry to the parking lot in cement in 2026/2027. We are looking ahead at needed work for 2026 and getting estimates for the 2026 budget. Lastly, though not a "maintenance" issue, the Chain Gangs was active in supporting the set-up and takedown of the rummage sale.

Lastly, in order to continue to maintain our campus as we all desire, the Chain Gang desperately needs new members to augment a team whose average age is at least 74. We meet on Saturday morning once a month (normally the 3rd Sat from 8:00-10:30 am) to address church landscape and maintenance tasks. By signing up, you are not promising to be there every month but to make it a priority to be there when you can.
