

MOC November 2025

We're busy. Our calendars are crowded, and our lives are overcommitted, especially this time of year. Holiday plans, travel plans, meal plans and of course gift giving seem to take center stage. It's also a time, if we can slow down for a New York minute, to reflect and give thanks for the abundance gifted to us. MOC is thankful for the support you have given us this year and in the last decade. We are thankful to have been a channel through which you have passed on your appreciation for our military families. Your generosity this fall meant that over 280 children from military families received new or gently used clothing at the Children's Clothing Fair. We are thankful for all those who donated clothing, who volunteered and who offered prayers for a successful outreach.

Are you looking for more ways to "pay it forward"? Can you help a military family celebrate Thanksgiving? The donation period for MOC's annual Thanksgiving Military Appreciation Food Drive ends Monday, November 3rd. This drive provides the makings for a traditional Thanksgiving Day dinner for each family, and we usually have well over 100 families requesting a dinner package. We are confident that with your help TLC can provide dinners for these military families on the morning of Saturday, November 22nd. If you haven't yet donated, please consider doing so (and get your donations in by this Sunday or Monday morning!). Dinner packages cost \$45 each, but any amount will help. Our thanks for your continued support of our military families

As Veterans Day approaches, we pause to Remember and Honor those who have served and who now rest in one of the 156 National Cemeteries around the world. By doing so we teach the next generation about what it is to serve and sacrifice for our country to protect the freedom and rights we hold dear.

If you wish to continue to show your gratitude for our fallen heroes, we encourage members to support Wreaths Across America by sponsoring a wreath(s) to place on the graves of service members at Miramar National Cemetery. This is an international effort to place a wreath on every grave of an American hero.

Finally, we offer you another way to "pay it forward", in time for Christmas! MOC will again team up with STEP (Support the Enlisted Project) to support its annual Christmas "Sharing the Joy" Toy Drive and Adopt a Family projects. Each year STEP has over 200 local military families registering for "adoption", and while many are adopted, some are not. For those families, the toy drive ensures that the children of non-adopted families "share the joy" of receiving toys. We encourage congregation members to purchase a toy(s)to make sure no child is left without a gift at Christmas. Toys are needed for both young and older children. Toys should not be wrapped, just remove the price tag and put them in one of the boxes in the foyer by Sunday, December14th.

Additionally, MOC will be adopting at least one family again this year, ensuring that each member of the family receives gifts from a provided wish list. 
Murphy Canyon Plane Crash Response

This past spring, members and friends of TLC raised \$9100 to help military families in Murphy Canyon impacted by the plane that crashed into their neighborhood. Most of the monies raised, \$7100, were used to purchase VISA debit cards which were given to Hancock Elementary administrators. May 2025 Financial Support






BROADER IMPACT

- · 34 families were affected.
- 5 families did not return to Hancock (due to PCS or promotion to middle school).
- · 7 families lost vehicles and were relocated.
- Thirty-two families had difficulty waiting for insurance policies, as they had to wait for financial support.
- 2 families refused assistance (their portion was redistributed).
- Four families did not return my call; voicemail and contact information were left.

This shows how families used the gift cards/financial aid:

- · The majority (15 families) used support for groceries.
- 1 family mentioned having to start over.
- · 1 family mentioned the need to purchase furniture.
- 1 family mentioned having to save for a car (miscellaneous).

HANCOCK FAMILIES

Families consistently expressed gratitude for the support. Many emphasized that groceries were their most immediate and pressing need. A few families without renters' insurance were in especially dire straits, as they lost possessions without compensation. Seven families experienced permanent relocations after losing vehicles, making recovery more difficult.

Although 2 families declined assistance, all available support was distributed across the community, ensuring no resources went unused.

Families reported using gift cards for groceries, clothes, furniture, and gas, aligning with essential needs.

Due to the nature of our practice and for the protection of our families' privacy, we cannot share specific information.




