Home Build Opportunity:

Hi everyone,

My name is Matthew Hall, and I'm excited to share a special opportunity with you all.

Since I was 12 years old, I've been crossing the border into Tijuana, Mexico, to help build homes for families in need. What started as a mission trip with my family and our church through Amor Ministries back in 2015, quickly became something much more meaningful to me. Every trip reminds me how blessed we are—and how close, just 40 minutes away, people are living in drastically different conditions. Seeing these different perspectives has encouraged me to give back in whatever way I can.



During my time at San Diego State
University, I joined a student organization
called Tijuana Home Build, where I've
continued to participate in home builds
every year—sometimes even multiple times
a year. Our group partners with a non-profit
called Casas de Luz (Houses of Light), led
by the incredible Kathy Faller, who's been
doing this work for over 20 years. Kathy and
I have grown close over the years, and
when I asked her if she'd host a new build

for my home church—she said yes without hesitation.

I grew up here in Tierrasanta, all 22 years, and when Pastor Bohdan approached me with his aspirations of leading the church in a home build, I jumped at the opportunity. I put Bohdan and Kathy in touch, and we've confirmed a date for our build! **Nov 22-23**.

This is a powerful opportunity to step outside our comfort zones, work together as a community, and serve those who truly need it. If you've never done something like this before, I encourage you to come. It's humbling. Eye-opening. And incredibly rewarding.

1st and 2nd Sundays: Singers


3rd Sundays: Handbells 4th Sundays: Both 5th Sundays: TBD

Military Outreach Updates

Can you believe it's almost fall? No eye-rolling please, but yes, MOC has its date for the Fall Children's Clothing Fair and it's September 25th. It's almost two months away, an eternity for sure, that gives everyone a little time to start looking through closets and dresser drawers (or under beds) for any children's clothing that could be donated to this outreach to help local military families provide clothing for their growing children. **MOC**



will begin collecting new and/or clean, gently used

children's clothing starting September 8th. This semi-annual ministry event is 100% dependent on the generosity of our church community to pass on children's clothing, or to spread the word to neighbors, friends and relatives. Everyone's help is needed to shine a light on the clothing needs of our military children.

Speaking of bright lights shining, TLC's light was shining brightly this past spring. First, with a most generous response from our congregation, MOC was able to assemble and distribute 90 food packages to local military families. Twenty awesome volunteers packed food bags, wrote out "Thank you for Your Service" cards, and distributed food packages and Commissary gift cards. Heartfelt thanks to all who helped MOC provide for these 90 families.

The food distribution took place 2 days after the airplane crash in Murphy Canyon housing. Many families who received a food package that day had been affected by the crash in some way. Some of those who received packages were taking their bags to displaced families. Which leads to a second light of generosity.

The TLC Crash Response was . . . AMAZING! Through your support over \$9000 was raised to help families directly affected by loss of their home, household goods and/or vehicles. We are thankful for all who responded with checks, anonymous cash donations, online contributions, and our very generous gardeners at the TLC Giving Garden.

Hancock Elementary administrators identified 7 families in immediate need of assistance. VISA debit cards totaling \$7100 were purchased and given to Hancock for distribution through Principal Irene Hightower. Additionally, with the approval of Carolyn Behling and the Giving Garden, the remaining \$2000 was donated to S.T.E.P. (Support the Enlisted Project), which offered to match crash response donations. The \$2000 TLC donation became \$4000 that will benefit crash victims with their longer-term needs such as vehicle assistance, housing and financial training. All crash response donations to S.T.E.P. will be used exclusively for military families affected by the crash.

Your contributions have already made a difference by providing essential supplies to families in need. Your generosity helps us extend our reach and better serve our military neighbors. THANK YOU, all our shining lights.

Director of Facilities & Equipment July Council Report

The DOFE team continues to work hard on items that need to be done around the church. The priority of DOFE has been on keeping the church buildings & landscape looking good, addressing issues as they arise, and doing preventive maintenance to avoid future problems.

As previously discussed, we are trying to work with the 7th Day Adventist to address the deteriorating asphalt at the entrance area to the parking lot that is used by both churches. The plan is to replace the asphalt in that area with reinforced cement that will withstand the heavy use it gets. Last month we gave Pastor Gary a proposal for the work that he could take to the 7DA Council and that resulted with a meeting with one of their Council members who is a General Contractor, and he agree the work needs



to be done, but not immediately. We are hoping that we can put the work off until 2027 but we need to start putting money aside for it in 2026. Discussion on the proposal, timing, etc. will continue until an agreement is reached.

We are currently in a struggle with gophers and/or ground squirrels that are borrowing in the preschool area and in front of the offices. Thus far it's "Critters 3, Maintenance Team 0". We tried humane traps to catch and relocate, then tried gassing the critters, and lastly tried to flood the tunnel complex they have in the outside area and under the church, yet they keep returning. Anyone with any experience with getting rid of these critters, we glad accept inputs on how to swing the tide to our side.

Regarding maintenance completed, though many of the Chain Ganger were out on vacation enjoying the summer, we still had 9 members make the 19 July Chain Gang workday and were able to accomplish most of the assigned task. Those items are listed along with other issues address over the last month below.

We desperately need new young blood (meaning men between 18-65) to join the Chain Gang (who's average age is 74). We meet on Saturday morning once a month (normally the 3rd Sat from 8:30-10:30 am) to address church landscape and maintenance tasks. By signing up, you are not promising to be there every month but to make it a priority to be there when you can. If you are interested or have questions, contact Ed Holler, Wayne Duke, or Mike McCann.

Maintenance accomplished in addition to this month's Chain Gang work day include the following: (1) Sprayed weeds throughout solar panel area; (2) Replaced broken swing seat & reseated rubber mat under the swing in east play area; (3) Repaired leaking children's toilet; (4) Replaced broken motion sensor light in preschool restroom; (5) Replaced worn cover for the Church BBQ; (6) Repainted small TLC sign at entry of parking lot.

Randy Frater has done an outstanding job of maintaining the lawns, the irrigation systems, & spraying the weeds that have been springing up all around the church property. The lawns in front of the church and Youth Building look green and beautiful.

Accomplishments for the Chain Gang Workday on July 19th:

- 1. Trimmed tree branches that overhang Memorial Garden & storage shed.
- 2. Trimmed bushes near Pre School area.
- 3. Weeded & trimmed bushes near flag pole, transformer area
- 4. Weeded area between Youth Building & Church & behind Youth Building
- 5. Weeded front area between parking lot & the street
- 6. Trimmed bushes on western side of the parking lot
- 7. Clear off the area behind and alongside the dumpster compartment.
- 8. Weeded areas in parking lot islands
