#### **Military Outreach Committee (MOC)**

As 2024 beckons us forward, I would like to first take a quick look back at the accomplishments of 2023 that are in keeping with the words of our MOC closing prayer at the end of each meeting – "always being mindful of Matthew 25 – "I was hungry, and you fed me; ... naked and you clothed me".

- Children's Clothing fairs in March and August provided clothing to a total of 148 military families.
- · Military Appreciation Food Drives in May and November provided food to 190 military families.
- Family Assistance Ministry Two junior military families that were having trouble feeding their families received a \$200 Commissary gift card to purchase needed food. Each family was vetted by Navy Chaplains as to their need for assistance.
- The Sharing The Joy Toy Drive and Adopt a Family project with STEP had MOC adopting one military family and providing each member 3 gifts from their wish list (plus potential adoptions by congregation members) and an overwhelming support for the toy drive to provide Christmas gifts to the children of non-adopted families.
- The Hancock Elementary School Harvest Wednesday's food distributions to local military families needed volunteer support to enable their distributions. MOC supported their weekly distributions in November and December with each providing food to 100 plus military families.

All of the above was enabled by the generosity of this congregation and we sincerely thank you for your support of our MOC ministries!

Looking forward to the coming year, our first Children's Clothing Fair is in March, so start gathering

used children clothing in good condition which we will take starting in February. Also, we especially need volunteers to assist in the support of the Hancock Harvest Wednesday food distributions – they occur every Wednesday 1:30-3:00 pm and we need three volunteers for each. It's right here in Tierrasanta, requires less than 2 hours of your time, and is an opportunity to interact with local military families. You'll leave the distribution with a very positive feeling after seeing the smiles and gratitude of the families receiving the food. If you could help even one Wednesday a month, please consider doing so or if you want more information, contact Wayne Duke (858-740-1068/wduke22@gmail.com).

Lastly, we hold our MOC meetings on first Wednesday of the month at 4:30-5:30 pm at TLC but have zoom available for those that can't make it in. Next meeting will be held January 3<sup>rd</sup>. **Thank you.** We are writing to you today to thank your church for the donation to our Fire Relief Fund here at the church for those affected by the devastating fire in Lahaina. I wanted to let you know that your help has allowed us to give some support to a few members who have lost their jobs, has provided food for our local food pantry which has gained a ton of displaced individuals, will add to our Thanksgiving feast that we are planning on putting together for the community and to help us during the Christmas season with gifts for children from the pantry. We are also working with one of the hubs in Lahaina which has had to move out of where they were located and has been placed in Napili, which is north of Lahaina and about a 20-minute drive for those who were helping right in the thick of things. The grant we received is exclusively going to be used for them and we are currently in the process of figuring out their biggest needs. At the beginning of the new year, we are looking forward to continuing our work with the hub, but also hope to team with the Lutheran Disaster Relief when they come to the island after most of the bigger organizations pull out their support. 



#### **Facilities Corner**

Many thanks to the Chain Gang, Scouts, and all the other volunteers who helped in 2023! It was a busy year that included many unexpected maintenance issues along with our monthly Chain Gang workdays, Spring and Fall Cleaning Saturdays, plus set-ups & take-downs for many events including the rummage sale, Easter, VBS, October Fest, Halloween, Christmas (lights, trees, chairs, tables, partitions) just to name a few. Thanks to all of the above volunteers, our facilities and landscaping are well maintained and looking good!

The unexpected maintenance issues for 2023 included: beehive removal, minisplit a/c in kitchen repair, drooping light fixtures in the youth building, electrical work on alarm/emergency lights, replacement of a parking lot LED light, kitchen garbage disposal replacement and clogged drain line has resulted in the maintenance spending being budget line being exceeded by an estimated \$1700. These items were addressed and fixed.

Improvement plans & projects for 2024 include: (1) Removing book shelves from library wall; (2) Replace library carpet with flooring in foyer; (3) Moving Sacristy



to last office space and make current sacristy area a staff office; (4) Roto rooter the drain line from patio to back steps; (5) Add the rain gutter along the east side by fellowship hall (6) Memorial Garden: Put hardy plants in the planter below the plaque wall & repair or replace the short black metal fence in the back of the garden & determine correct method to clean, polish faded bronze name plates & implement; (7) Replace the mini blinds at the Preschool; (8) Repair the parking lot; (9) Replace the brown, folding chairs with comfortable, stackable chairs. This is not a complete list and other items will most likely be added during the year.

In addition to the above plans & projects for 2024, we have to clean & maintain our TLC facilities & landscaping, set-up & take-down for TLC events, Spring & Fall cleaning days and monthly Chain Gang workdays. If you are not already a member of the Chain Gang, please consider joining our group. Coffee, donuts, water are provided. Please come to our next event!

#### **Applying Bible Principles**

There are some wonderful principles in the Old Testament which apply to present-day Christians. One of these is in Deuteronomy 8:10-18. Stated in contemporary language, it says, "When you have eaten and are full, when your cars, houses and bank accounts multiply, don't forget where it came from: Remember the Lord your God."

In truth, all that we have comes from God. He determines what we will receive, whether it be money, gold, silver, houses, land, bank accounts, stocks, bonds, etc. It all belongs to Him in the first place, and He entrusts it to us. According to David's prayer in 1 Chronicles 29, riches, honor, power, and wealth all come from God.

That's why there is no such thing as a self-made man or woman. Oh, we have to do our part. God's plan is not that we just sit around praying and reading the Bible all day long so that what we need to survive will miraculously drop into our hands. We're not just to pray for "our daily bread," but we're also to get up each day and work for it! That's why the Apostle Paul stated clearly, "Anyone unwilling to work should not eat" (2 Thes. 3:10). But in reality, the amount of money and wealth which we receive is determined by God. According to His divine will and knowledge, He entrusts to each of us the amounts which He knows will be best for us.

What should be our reaction to our financial state? Some might pray, "Dear Lord, you must have made a mistake concerning me and my finances. Please give me more money." Others might try to circumvent God's design for their lives by trying to win the lottery or to obtain large sums of money through some other means. Mature Christians, however, will realize God's infinite wisdom far surpasses their limited perspective. They will accept with a thankful spirit what God has entrusted to them and seek to honor God by their living and by their giving.

You will also need to register specifically for St. Steven's which generally opens around 10 days before the event.
