The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

1. Nehemiah Combines Prayer with Fasting

Nehemiah 1:4, NIV

When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and <u>fasted</u> and <u>prayed</u> before the God of heaven.

2. Nehemiah Addresses the God of Heaven

When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the <u>God of heaven</u>.

Nehemiah 1:5, NIV

Then I said: "Lord, the <u>God of heaven</u>, the <u>great</u> and <u>awesome God</u>, who <u>keeps his</u> <u>covenant of love</u> with those who love him and keep his commandments,

3. Nehemiah is Persistent in His Prayer

Nehemiah 1:6a. NIV

let your ear be attentive and your eyes open to hear the prayer your servant is praying before you <u>day and night</u> for your servants, the people of Israel.

4. Nehemiah Intercedes on Behalf of His People

Nehemiah 1:6b, NIV

I <u>confess</u> the sins <u>we</u> Israelites, including <u>myself</u> and <u>my father's family</u>, have committed against you.

Nehemiah 1:7, NIV

<u>We</u> have <u>acted very wickedly</u> toward you. <u>We</u> have <u>not obeyed</u> the commands, decrees and laws you gave your servant Moses.

So the message of the Lord spoken through Jeremiah was fulfilled. The land finally enjoyed its Sabbath rest, lying desolate until the <u>seventy years were fulfilled</u>, just as the prophet had said.

5. Nehemiah Recounts God's Promises

Nehemiah 1:8. NIV

"Remember the instruction you gave your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the nations,

Nehemiah 1:9, NIV

but if you <u>return to me</u> and <u>obey my commands</u>, then even if your exiled people are at the farthest horizon, I will gather them from there and bring them to the place I have chosen as a dwelling for my Name."

Nehemiah 1:10, NIV

"They are your servants and your people, whom you <u>redeemed</u> by your great strength and your mighty hand.

6. Nehemiah Asks for God's Favor

Nehemiah 1:11, NIV

Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of this your servant and to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name. <u>Give your servant success</u> today by <u>granting him favor</u> in the presence of this man." I was cupbearer to the king.

<u>Isaiah 45:12, NLT</u>

I am the one who made the earth and created people to live on it. With my hands I stretched out the heavens. All the stars are at my command.

Isaiah 40:12, NLT
