

I Will Survive

Acts 28:1-6

¹Once we were safe on shore, we learned that we were on the island of Malta. ²The people of the island were very kind to us. It was cold and rainy, so they built a fire on the shore to welcome us.

³As Paul gathered an armful of sticks and was laying them on the fire, a poisonous snake, driven out by the heat, bit him on the hand. ⁴The people of the island saw it hanging from his hand and said to each other, “A murderer, no doubt! Matthew 7:1-5 (MEV)

¹“Judge not, that you be not judged. ²For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged. And with the measure you use, it will be measured again for you. ³“And why do you see the speck that is in your brother’s eye, but do not consider the plank that is in your own eye? ⁴Or how will you say to your brother, ‘Let me pull the speck out of your eye,’ when a log is in your own eye? ⁵You hypocrite! First take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother’s eye.

3. Shake Off the Attacks of the Enemy.

Acts 28:5

⁵But Paul shook off the snake into the fire and was unharmed.

4. Watch God Use Your Testimony.

Acts 28:6-10

⁶ The people waited for him to swell up or suddenly drop dead. But when they had waited a long time and saw that he wasn't harmed, they changed their minds and decided he was a god. ⁷ Near the shore where we landed was an estate belonging to Publius, the chief official of the island. He welcomed us and treated us kindly for three days. ⁸ As it happened, Publius's father was ill with fever and dysentery. Paul went in and prayed for him, and laying his hands on him, he healed him. ⁹ Then all the other sick people on the island came and were healed. ¹⁰ As a result we were showered with honors, and when the time came to sail, people supplied us with everything we would need for the trip.
