OSHA and DOSH requirements for dealing with bloodborne pathogens:

1. All school employees must be trained how to properly deal with the bloodborne pathogens. The *Safety Line Bloodborne Pathogens Exposure Control Plan for Schools* is adequate training when a health professional is present to emphasize the program and answer questions.
2. The Conference must document and file evidence of training for each employee.
3. Schools should appoint one person as primary first aid care giver. This person should be first aid certified and preferably CPR certified. It is highly recommended that all appointed care givers be inoculated with the hepatitis B vaccination.
4. Schools must provide necessary protection devices and have them available. The devices are to include but not be limited to: approved first aid kit, disposable rubber gloves, disposable plastic bags with ties, eye protection devices, resuscitation device for bodily fluid protection, face mask, disinfectant for clean-up.
5. Schools must report to the conference annually, on this Connection form, the school's compliance with the OSHA regulations dealing with bloodborne pathogens.

The following documents compliance with OSHA regulations:

Employee training is documented in school file.

One employee has been appointed as prime emergency care giver and has a current first aid certificate.
