

To Persevere in Obedience

Jeremiah 37:11-17. 38:4-6. 14-18

Jeremiah was a man that persevered: He kept getting up each time he was knocked down.

- 1. He was arrested for deserting to the enemy: Jer. 37: 12, 32:1-5
- 2. He was accused of demoralizing the army: Jer. 38:6
- 3. He was asked to deliver the message to the king: Jer. 38:15

The Means to Persevere: What does it mean to persevere in obedience?

- 1. Stand by your convictions: Jer. 1:18, Luke 19:10
- 2. Make the right choices: Those that persevere choose not to stay down, they get up!
- 3. Maintain personal character: Jeremiah kept his character intact.
- 4. Refuse to compromise: It cost Jeremiah, yet he never compromised his calling or the message.

Conclusion: In the end, after you have been knocked down many times, will you choose to rise each time; will your legacy be that of Jeremiah's?
