Do not be afraid—I am with you! I am your God—let nothing terrify you! I will make you strong and help you; I will protect you and save you.

Isaiah 41:10

I was having lunch with a pastor recently and as we talked about our plans for 2024 we became aware of the distress and worry in a nearby couple's conversation. It was obvious that they were fearful of what 2024 would bring. They discussed politics, illness and deaths of friends and family members, work, the economy, and other areas of concern. It was evident that they were very fearful and concerned for what lies ahead for them, for our country, and the world in this year. However, the only console they seemed to be able to muster for which to find assurance was, "Well, we will get through it somehow, we always do." As I silently prayed for them I began to wonder if they were persons of faith, Christians of any measure.

I, and I am sure many of you also, share the concerns this couple were voicing. It is a troubling and distraught world we live in these days. King Hezekiah wrote Isaiah 41:10 as he and Israel felt abandoned and helpless after the war and no amount of self-help seemed to comfort them or change their distress. As humans and Christians we face this cold world and it often brings real situations of fear and helplessness. What Israel and King Hezekiah found out by the prophet Isaiah was that God had a message for them, one of hope and security even in the most dire of times. We can find this hope in multiple verses of God's Word and Isaiah 41:10 can assure us as it did Israel.

Very soon we will encounter Ash Wednesday, Lent, and the incredibly early Easter. These times are replete with images and points of reflection of how God sustains His people. During Lent our sermon series is titled "God's Promises: From the Garden to the Cross." Each Sunday of Lent we will focus on a major promise that God has made with humanity. In all of these abundant promises we find His unyielding love for His people.

My friends, in all of this, may we remember Isaiah's words and know we can live in this world without fear and terror of what may occur; that His promises are secure and He will keep us and protect us, and save us! Let us all face 2024 with wild abandon and certainty of faith, for God is always with us!

Midwest Mission has only seven full-time and three part-time staff members. The mission volunteers do 100% of the assembly and preparation of items for distribution. They assemble kits, build desks, repair bicycles and sewing machines, sort and count materials, stuff mailings, sew, unload donations, assist with maintenance and meet the day's needs. Whatever your abilities, there is an important job that needs you! Work will be prioritized and set up each day based on the most pressing needs of the volunteers. There is space for 16 team members: 7 have already committed to going. The cost is \$350 per person (housing, food, Center fees). The first team meeting will be SUNDAY, APRIL 14 at 2:00pm. Please let Mary Eddy know by the end of February if you feel God's call to join the team.

Beth's Recipe Box . . .

Caramel French Toast

Courtesy of the Doubleday Inn, Gettysburg, PA

- 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2 T light corn syrup
- 8 slices thickly sliced or diced Italian bread
- 6 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 t vanilla
- 1/8 t salt

In a saucepan combine brown sugar, butter, and corn syrup. Bring to a full boil, reduce heat to medium and simmer until thickened (approx. 2-3 minutes). Pour mixture into a greased 9x13 inch baking dish. Place bread evenly in pan. Beat eggs and add all other ingredients. Pour over bread. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

In the morning bake, uncovered, 45 minutes in a 350° oven, until light brown. Serve with warm syrup. Serves 8.

During Lent and Easter we will explore the promises of God to His people. These promises start with the promise to Adam and Eve in Garden of Eden and stretch to the Cross, and prove God's unfailing and forgiving love for us.

ASH WEDNESDAY: 02/14/2024 7:00 P.M. SERMON TITLE: TAKE HEED

In Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21 we are reminded to not do things for the attention of others. What we do, we should do for and to God not for the benefit of others.

1ST SUNDAY OF LENT - 02/18/2024 SERMON TITLE: GOD'S PROMISES TO NOAH

God makes promises to Noah, with a sign "for all ages to come" (Gen 9:8-15). The psalm reminds us that God's ways "are love and truth to those who keep [his] covenant" (see Ps 25:10).

2ND SUNDAY OF LENT - 02/25/2024 SERMON TITLE: GOD'S PROMISES TO ABRAHAM

Abraham offers his son Isaac to God, willing to sacrifice his only son. Because he obeys God's command, he receives his son and confirmation of an amazing blessing that extends to all the nations of the earth (Gen 22). "I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living," reads the Psalm response. Obedience leads to life, not death.

3RD SUNDAY OF LENT – 03/03/2024 SERMON TITLE: GOD'S PROMISES TO MOSES

God brings his children out of slavery in Egypt and gives them the Ten Commandments: laws to help them live as His children (Exodus 20). Then Psalm 19: the law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing, and trustworthy! The Ten Commandments are, in fact, "the words of everlasting life."

4TH SUNDAY OF LENT – 03/10/2024 SERMON TITLE: CALLED TO GOD'S PROMISE

God sends prophets "early and often" to call his people back to his promised love. They refuse and are sent into exile, and then the Lord draws them out to return and rebuild (2 Chr 36). "Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you!", we respond with Psalm 137, along with the exiles in Babylon.

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT – 03/17/2024 SERMON TITLE: GOD'S NEW PROMISE

As the people head into exile, Jeremiah announces a day when God will make a new promise with them and write it on their hearts! (Jer 31:33-34). "Create in me a clean heart", we reply with Psalm 51.

PALM SUNDAY – 03/24/2024 SERMON TITLE: ENTERING GOD'S PROMISE

Old and New are drawn together in the words of Isaiah, who says "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard..." (Isa 50:6). Then, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" – Jesus himself takes up the refrain from Psalm 22. Everything in the Old finds its fulfillment in the New, and we enter Passion Week reliving our baptism into his death and awaiting the glorious resurrection.

MAUNDY THURSDAY- 03/28/2024 7:00 P.M. SERMON TITLE: THE BREAD IS READY

In John 13:1-7, 31-35, we read the account of the Last Supper which reminds us of the importance of humility, selflessness, and service to others.

GOOD FRIDAY – 03/29/2024 **MOVIE:** A **RESURRECTION THEMED MOVIE** Join us in the church sanctuary at 7 P.M. to watch a movie centered on the Resurrection. This movie is a fictional account of the Resurrection through the curious eyes of a Roman guard. It is extremely moving and worth your time! (Note: Not the same movie as last year!)

EASTER SUNDAY – 03/31/2024 **SERMON TITLE: FULLFILLED PROMISES** This Sunday marks the celebration of Christ raised from the grave! In that, it speaks to all the promise of God coming to fulfillment. Join us as we celebrate the risen King!


