The Hope of All the Earth!

It is upon us! Advent! It started last Sunday, November 30th! I know the retail spaces start early, wanting us to believe that the latest wares they are peddling somehow offer us "the most wonderful time of the year!", as the jolly jingle refers to Christmas. But it is the season that leads up to Christmas, Advent, that truly is the most wonderful truth all year!!

Some traditions refuse to decorate the house, place a wreath on the door, or decorate a tree until Christmas Eve, purposely leaving the weeks leading up to Christmas stark. But this is not because there is no rejoicing in Christmas, but rather it is the anticipation of hope! Not just hope for a "good day" where things are "merry and bright". Most days, that can be elusive. But hope? Hope for each day and hope for all the earth. And the everlasting hope that God will someday make all things right, which is true at Christmas and on July 27th!!!

Thank you for the many hands that helped during the National Collection Week for Operation Christmas Child. A total of 253 shoeboxes were packed by Community Chapel, including 41 packed at our Children's Mission Event with NCLC families and staff, 45 by SAGES, and another 167 shoeboxes were packed by individuals or families of our congregation and NCLC. Our teens group helped with pre-folding boxes and with loading over 115 cartons filled with packed shoeboxes onto the trailers.

Our drop off center collected a total of 2,907 shoeboxes from about 25 of local area churches, schools and groups. As a central drop off, we loaded 8,364 shoeboxes this year from the other six church drop offs in our southern New England region, necessitating us to stack the cartons five high to fit into the two trailers. 18 large boxes of filler items were also donated and loaded on the trailers. These shoeboxes represent great generosity from our area that will provide Gospel opportunities for children in far areas of the world to learn of God's love which they can share with their families and community.


