IN A SHEPHERD'S WORD

“Only One Thing”

It's appropriate that I write this article on the Day of Epiphany. This is the day we commemorate in the Church Year that the wise men finally encountered the infant King. But what was it that drove them? They could very well have sought to give their gifts to a puppet King like Herod, and maybe even received accolades. But what was it that drove them across the harsh conditions and many miles for upwards of 24 months? There is **ONLY ONE THING**.

In this age of distraction, we all can fall into the trap of forgetting what the **ONLY ONE THING** is that is the most essential thing. In an age when we are drawn to a consumeristic spirituality, or a political and partisan agenda, or an uncomfortably close proximity to wealth, possession, and power, we need to be reminded that there is **ONLY ONE THING**. In an effort to maintain a relationship with God that is built on our own efforts, our own works, our own value, our own desires, we need to be reminded that there is **ONLY ONE THING**.

So, because of the reality of this age of distraction that we can be lured into, we are going to spend a month remembering **ONLY ONE THING**. And when we are done, the hope is that this will be more than a series of talks given in church. But that **ONLY ONE THING** will change the way we engage all other things.

What is the **ONLY ONE THING**? Join us Sundays this winter to find out. But in the meantime, here's a hint. Follow the Wisemen. And, then, pray this prayer we concluded our Covenant Service with...

*You are mine, and I am Yours. So be it. May this covenant that I have made here on earth
be ratified in heaven. Amen.*


YOUNG ADULT GROUP (18-30 years old)

WINTER SUNDAY JOURNEY GROUPS WILL BEGIN **JANUARY 11TH**



This group will meet on **Sundays at 9:00 AM in Room 305 beginning on January 11th** and will be studying **Hebrews: A 12-Week Study**. The book of Hebrews stands apart from other biblical books in its theologically unique portrait of Jesus Christ as the supreme revelation of God - a portrait bolstered by the author's skilled use of imagery, metaphor, and Old Testament analogy. This accessible guide walks readers through the book of Hebrews, one of the most beautifully written and theologically rich books in the New Testament. This group will meet on **Sundays at 9:00 AM in Room 306 beginning on January 11th** and will be studying **Not Beyond Reach** by Aaron Pierce. He explains how discipleship relationships start even before a friend or loved one accepts Christ. As you build trust over time, you open doors to share the Gospel. Aaron begins by demystifying the underlying inconsistencies and idols at the heart of secular beliefs. Then he outlines a new playbook for reaching the next generation and others who would not walk into a church. The process involves intentionality and radical dependence on the Holy Spirit and God to move. It also involves authentic relationships and perceptive listening and communication skills. *Not Beyond Reach* provides examples and strategies to help readers progress from friendship conversations to spiritual conversations to Gospel conversations that transform lives. 

WEDNESDAY MORNING WOMEN'S GROUP






SATURDAY MORNINGS MOM'S GROUP


MEN'S TUESDAY NIGHT JOURNEY GROUP
