IN A SHEPHERD'S WORD

Table Talks on Immigration

When they said it to me, I was grieved. It was a conversation with a Spirit-filled brother who is an immigrant. When I asked what it was like to be an immigrant in our country, he said this, "I don't know if I will ever feel welcomed."

"Lord, **when did we see...you a stranger and invite you in**..." The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, **you did it for me.'"** (Matthew 25:38-40)

On October 15th at 5:00 PM, Bruce Wilson and I began **Table Talks on Immigration** in the Parlor across from the sanctuary. How are we thinking about the events and issues of the world around us? Too often, we are more shaped and discipled by the vehicles of the culture than we are by God's perspective. One of those areas is immigration. Let's ask the question, "Are we shaped by culture or formed by Scripture?"

The hope for this time is to resist the shaping of the predominant narratives driven by the news media, partisan divides, and social media-stoked fears and misrepresentations. This will not be a time for debate, partisan rhetoric, or binary, us vs. them thinking. Instead, we have a higher aim. A charitable discourse! This is an invitation to surrender our preconceived biases and opinions and open our minds and hearts to God, His word, and to one another.

On November 23rd, we will host Rev. Rachel Hafner, the New England District Director of Immigration Ministries. That Sunday, we will feature the ministry of Immigration Connection (more information to come!). In preparation for that gathering, we will come together to invite the Holy Spirit to shape and mold us with God's perspective. Using the discussion guide, **Together at the Table**, we will listen, learn, and pray to be formed by what the Bible says about immigrants and immigration.

MISSION AND MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES COLLECTION OF FOOD FOR THANKSGIVING BASKETS 2025

We will once again be filling Thanksgiving baskets to bless families in our church community and local community. Below is a list of items that we will be collecting now through November 9th. Plastic bins are in the main hallway to drop these items in. It will cost approximately \$60 to fill a basket which will include a small Market Basket gift card to purchase a turkey or perishable items. Items for Thanksgiving Baskets:

Stuffing - bread, corn. Bags or boxes, Pie crust-boxed, two for every basket,
Pie filling - apple, blueberry, cherry, peach, pear etc. (two cans per pie needed),
Potatoes - (white or yams, or sweet potatoes) in a can or box!
Gravy- package or jar, Evaporated Milk
Canned Vegetables - corn, sting beans, peas, beans, carrots, beets, asparagus, olives,
Muffin mixes- blueberry, cinnamon, fruit, corn, etc., Cookie mixes

Dried flower (Fall colors), Cloth or Paper napkins, Fall Fabric to line baskets, Fall table clothes. Cash Donations for items including gift cards for turkey purchases (checks made out to CC marked "Thanksgiving Baskets")

Community Chapel has participated in the ministry of Operation Christmas Child for over 25 years, sharing the Gospel and God's love through packing and collecting shoeboxes, sharing the Hope we have in Jesus with children in all parts of the world.

Join us in this great ministry as we serve and show God's love by packing shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child and/or by volunteering during the **National Collection Week November 17**th- **24**th. Community Chapel is a central drop off for all of southern New Hampshire.

Opportunities to pack shoeboxes in a variety of ways include:

- Family shoebox packing Mission Event on Wednesday, November 5th
- SAGES shoebox packing and luncheon Friday, November 14th
- Pack shoeboxes at home and bring them to Community Chapel. Preprinted shoeboxes will be handed
 out at church each Sunday beginning October 19th or use a shoebox you have at home. By activating
 your adhesive label online, you can follow your shoebox to find out which country it went to. A
 donation of \$10.00 per shoebox covers costs to collect, process, transport the shoeboxes, provide
 gospel materials in their native language, and train local churches in their country. Include a personal
 note or letter. Reminder: no soap, liquids, creams, candy or cash.
- Build a shoebox online by choosing items for your shoebox which go to hard-to-reach areas.

- Drop off extra or misc. loose items to be used at our "packing parties" or sent to the processing centers to be used as filler items.
- Shoeboxes may be dropped off at Community Chapel on Sunday, November 16th.

Join our team of volunteers who are needed to greet and accept the hundreds of packed shoeboxes dropped off at Community Chapel by local individuals, groups and churches during the National Collection Week of November 17th -24th. Please help us greet, accept shoeboxes, load into cartons, load into the semi-trucks and pray over the shoeboxes. We have a great time of fellowship as we serve together!


