THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR AARON

In 1404, King Taejong of Korea fell off his horse. It happens to the best of us. Wanting to avoid embarrassment, he commanded the court historians not to record the event. They did. Even his request to them was written down and faithfully kept.

One factor that lends credibility to a historical document is the inclusion of embarrassing material. A king would not make up a story about falling off his own horse, and so this is more believable than an account of him benching 400 in high school would be.

This same dynamic is a key reason we can trust the Gospels. The disciples were towering figures in the early church. If the gospels were fabrications, there's really no explanation why they are so brutally honest in their depiction of the disciples. There's also the benefit to us, and anyone who has fallen off their horse. These were humans no different than any other, caught up in the wake of the Messiah. And so are we.
