but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin.

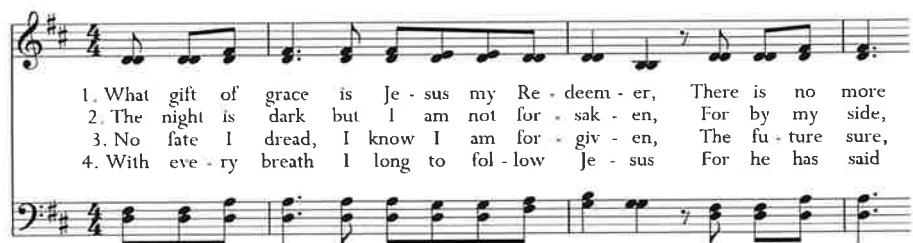
