Community Care Days

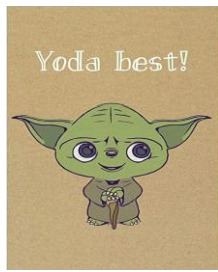

As you probably know this is my last Jon's Jottings from Monmouth First UMC. And all I can think of to say is...THANK YOU!

Seventeen and a half years ago on January 8, 2006, Anita, Justin, and I moved into your beautiful parsonage and began working and living here in this wonderful town and amazing church. Do you remember what I preached about that first Sunday? Nope? Neither do I! I'm sure it was very forgettable!

I do remember how I felt, though. And I felt...welcomed! You all did an amazing job of making us feel welcome right away. I really don't remember any difficulties appearing on that first Sunday or even during those first few weeks. All I remember is feeling welcomed and feeling at home right from the start. I know we were provided food and fellowship and as I've told you before...we were even shown fellowship before we moved here. I actually came across the letter Jan Gebauer sent to us before we moved here and that letter and so many others, made us all feel like we were coming to our new home right away. Most of you know this, but Jan was the church administrative assistant and financial secretary and the treasurer for quite a while and she, of course, did an amazing job. When Jan retired, we never even had much of a worry because right away LeAnn came on board and now she holds the distinction (if that is what it is) of having to put up with me for the longest of any secretary-administrative assistant-financial secretary with whom I have had the pleasure of working. So, all through all the 17 ½ years, it has always been a joy coming to work.

Lots of interesting things have happened here. Just being allowed to be somewhere for 17 ½ years is amazing to me. I never dreamed that would be the case for us. And now when I look at the 36 years I have been a pastor and see that almost half of them were right here in Monmouth, I thank God and all of you that this is true.

God has blessed me in so many ways and it humbles me to even think about the life God has given me to live. Every night as I settle in to get ready to fall asleep...I thank God...for our family and for all of you. You have put up with a motorcycling, bicycle riding, running, grandparent becoming, bad joke telling, irreverent at times pastor. You have provided us a safe and wonderful home, you have paid us well, and you have

been there to help in so very many ways. It absolutely humbles me to think about all the kind things you have done for us and all the ways you have shown love to us.

And here's the thing...I realize I don't deserve it at all. From being born into the family I was, where I never had to wonder if I was loved, to marrying the girl who sat behind me in history and had to put up with all my talking and goofing off, then to have the amazing children and grandchildren we have, and to the health I've enjoyed...I am so blessed. God has been with us each step of the way...even when I had no idea God was there...God was THERE. And guess what? God is still there...still here with us. I always wanted to be the best at

something...but to my chagrin, I never have been...but I can say honestly that I have been blessed beyond understanding to be able to pastor in a church that has always pastored to our family in amazing ways. Through the death of my brother, the births of our grandchildren, both Justin and Anita graduating from college, Anita's Dad passing away, my diagnosis of Leukemia, COVID, all the building stuff...you have been there, and been here...and I thank God...and thank YOU for it all.

And here's the other thing...I don't ever want to discount at all...You have let me and let us...be us the entire time we have been here. Pastors discuss churches just the same as churches discuss pastors and suffice it to say...you letting your pastor and family simply be who they are is not always the case...and we thank God for you!

So...in a month pastor Shelly Forrest will be your new pastor. She will bring gifts and graces that I do not have to you as she becomes your new pastor. I hope and expect that she will see and experience the warmth and the acceptance you have shown to Anita and me throughout our time here. God has called her here and God has called you to be her church and her family's home. And I trust that in how ever many years from now it is her time to leave as your pastor she will be saying, just as I...just as we do...Thank YOU! God Bless you...and may God work God's highest Good in you and in the ministries of Monmouth First UMC!
