## Blessed Broken Given

Through the month of October, during worship, we will be talking about what it is to live our LIVES as “bread.” What does it mean for us to be BLESSED, BROKEN and GIVEN in the same ways that Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to His disciples.


Throughout Scripture, we discover that nothing is as common as it seems, not even bread. Mysterious and holy bread fell from heaven daily for forty years as a sign of God’s provision to Moses and God’s chosen people as they wandered in the wilderness before entering the promised land. Bread became a metaphor for the law of the Lord. Jesus fed the multitudes with loaves of bread and Jesus referred to himself as “the bread of life.” Then, on the night that He was handed over to suffering and death, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to His disciples as a picture of His body being given for the life of the world.

It is far too easy for us to believe that the ordinary, routine-filled days of our lives are all that God has in store for us. To the contrary, in the hands of Christ, the very ordinary spaces of our lives become sacred and even miraculous. We see this reality take place in the way Jesus uses bread, ordinary bread, in the New Testament. The Gospel of Luke records *three* stories about Jesus taking bread in His hands, blessing it, breaking it, and giving it. As believers it is so important that we see ourselves as God sees us. We are His children, His creation, His masterpieces. We are “blessed.” “Blessed” does not mean what the world thinks it means. Blessed isn’t about the abundance of our things or our possessions. Blessed means that we are called to be part of the family of God. We are part of a story that is bigger than ourselves. And we know that the end of that story is AMAZINGLY good!

It is important that we understand that our brokenness makes us open to the grace of God. Before I was broken, I did not understand how much I needed God. I thought I was pretty good. Like others, I might have said, “I don’t know why Jesus needed to DIE for me. I’m not that bad.” Until I was “broken” I would not have ever fully comprehended how God takes a wounded soul and makes it whole, and how incredible that is! But because I was “broken” and now am whole, God’s grace is clear, and I can do nothing less than give.

GIVE. Broken, blessed, and given. When we have been healed, it is hard to contain our joy! We GIVE to others when we share our story, when we let others know what God has done for us—how God has taken our ordinary “bread” lives and made them so much more.

I hope you will be here through the month of October as we explore our lives as “bread!”
