## Advent Study Coming Soon!



Advent is about not only waiting, but also preparation. There are a lot of things to prepare for during this season—parties, presents, family gatherings, and such. But what if instead of all these things, we were preparing for Jesus, the Son of the Living God, to come into our lives in a meaningful way?

I am giving you an opportunity to prepare spiritually for this season. I have discovered a study written by Louie Giglio. Ironically, Louie is a Baptist pastor. Baptists have traditionally not embraced “Advent.” But Louie takes a dive in and has written a study that I believe is rich.

The sessions are:

1) God is at work while you wait.

The people of Israel understood what it meant to wait. God had promised through His prophets to send them a Messiah. But generation after generation, God’s promise did not come to pass. Yet this didn’t mean that God was doing nothing while they waited. God was at work and is still at work.

2) God will use your waiting.

Each generation of Israel likely wrestled with a sense of disappointment as they realized they were apparently not going to live to see God’s promise realized. However, those faithful to God knew that the Lord had not forgotten them or rescinded His promise—even if they didn’t experience it the way they wanted.

3) Waiting on God and with God.

Loneliness often increases during the holidays. But we need to remind ourselves that we are never truly alone. The birth of Jesus demonstrates God’s willingness to take on human form. He became Emmanuel, “God with us.”

4) God is waiting for you.

God wants us to receive so much more than we expect. He’s already ahead of us, using our circumstances, choices, and consequences as He shapes His plans for our lives. No matter what you’re waiting for, God is already there, waiting for you.

I will be leading the study on **Sunday, December 3, 10, 17** and **January 7** from 10:45 a.m.-12:15 p.m. and **Thursday, December 7, 14, 21** and **January 11** from 6:30-8:00 p.m. in the Lounge. Study guidebooks will be available at the Welcome Center. A donation of \$15 would be appreciated, but not required.

As we come to November, I am filled with thoughts of all the gratitude that this month holds. We begin by honoring the Saints who have taught us by word and example to have the faith that we have today. I invite you to think of those who are still living or those who have entered the Great Church Triumphant who had impacted your life and helped lead you to a life of hope, faith, service, worship, and dedication. If you can, write them a note or call them to say thank you. If you can't do that, say a prayer. Thank God for their example and seek to be the same kind of example for those who follow you.

Then, we have Veterans Day. This is not a church holiday per se, but it is a day that we dedicate to being thankful for the men and women who have served or are currently serving in the military to protect us and the freedoms that we enjoy. As a pastor, and as a Christian, I enjoy very much that I live in a country where I am free to worship, and I can speak boldly of my faith without fear of persecution or other repercussions. If you are a veteran, or if you are a parent of a veteran, I thank God for you! Thank a veteran!

On November 12, we will be baptizing Zachariah DeCrane! I am grateful that we have a church with little ones, and with faithful parents who wish to raise their children to have the same faith that gives US strength. (If I have not yet said this in this church—when little ones make loud noises in church, I REJOICE! Because it means we have little ones in church! And Jesus spoke very clearly about the value of children!) I hope you will be here as we, the Church vow to lead him in a way that leads to faith!

Not long after that is Thanksgiving Day, a day that we specifically dedicate to gratitude. A long time ago, I read a book (part of the Mitford series) in which the small-town parish pastor has the thought, “What if God took from me everything for which I have never said thanks?” It was a very eye-opening question! It helps you to look around yourself and be thankful for all the little things and the simple things. I will never forget an African pastor who came to our Annual Conference many years ago. He had been taken into a parsonage that had been empty for several years. He turned on the faucet while he was inside and clean, clear water ran out of it. He said, “you don’t understand—in my country, people walk for MILES to get to a well to get just enough clean water for the day and they carry it home in huge jugs on their heads. And here you had this resource just sitting here, being unused for all this time!” It helps put things into perspective! Be grateful for even the little things we take for granted.

And finally, at the end of the month, we will be decorating the church together and preparing for one of the most beautiful seasons in the church—the season of Advent—of waiting and of anticipation of the coming of our Savior.

God has truly blessed us. May we recognize that all we have is God's. We are only caretakers for the time being. And out of our gratitude may we also seek to be generous!

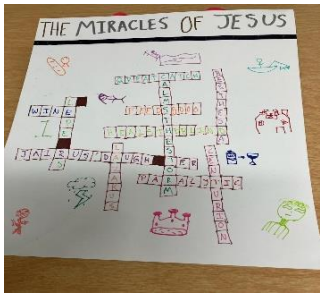




## Grace Place, our youth Sunday School

## Wesley Foundation

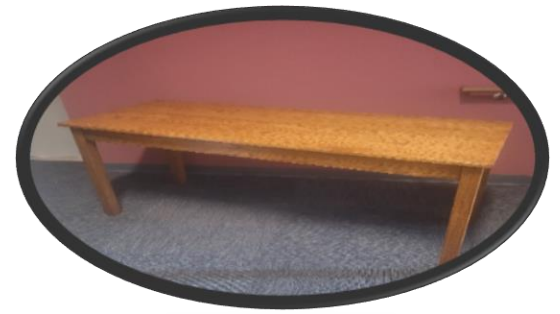
