Early in August, wind-driven fires on Maui prompted evacuations and caused significant damage and loss of life. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is working with the California-Pacific Annual Conference to provide emergency supplies such as shelf-stable food, water, hygiene items and tools to help survivors recover belongings.

A portion of your offering on any given Sunday helps cover the administrative costs for UMCOR so that when disaster strikes, and our hearts are moved to give compassionately, 100% of your gift can be used to aid the people in need. If you would like to contribute to the disaster fund for Maui, you may put a check in the offering plate or mail it to the church and put "UMCOR" or "Maui" in the memo blank, and we will put all of our contributions together and send them at the end of September.



## Short Term Study

I will be offering this study on Sundays in the Lounge during Youth Group time, 6:00-7:30 p.m., beginning on Sunday, September 10. (We will decide as a group when to have the 5<sup>th</sup> session due to the VBS follow-up game night on Oct 8.) I will also offer the study on Thursdays from 6:00-7:30 p.m. beginning Thursday, September 7.
