**Capital Campaign** pledges reach the goal of \$3.5 million! Exciting news that we recently achieved this in early July 2018. To be at the final mark is an amazing accomplishment and everyone in our congregation should be proud and thanked as we had a 90 % + participation rate. We now have \$3.5M in pledges, and we are less than \$200,000 away from collecting all of it, as many made a pledge on the three year plan which ends later this year. Our debt on this project is very low, and assuming the pledges come in as planned, we expect to be debt-free again as a church by January 1, 2019. If you have made a pledge and are able to finish off your fulfillment of such pledge, it will put us at our goal of full collection.

The Mission Outreach Committee is hosting a **Pajama and Book Drive next, Sunday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>** to benefit the Palm Beach County chapter of the Pajama Program. Bring either new pajamas and/or new books for children of all ages to church that day and drop them off in the collection boxes in the Narthex. Donations will be distributed to various nonprofit organizations in Palm Beach County, including several that we support through our Mission Outreach budget.

**Next Sunday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>**, you are invited to help sort the pajamas and books that will be donated to the **Pajama and Book Program**. The sorting will be done in **Fellowship Hall immediately following the worship service**. Please help us prepare these donations to be distributed to children in our community.

## **Our Main Church Financial Accounts and Funding**

---

**Operating account/Stewardship/Annual Pledge Funds** – This is our main account, with the majority of the cash raised from the annual Stewardship Campaign, or annual pledges. These funds are what the church uses every day to pay mission outreach, salaries, power bills, insurance, maintenance, etc. Our annual budget is approximately \$1.45 million dollars and our pledges typically come in lower than this amount. On top of pledges, we get money from plate and special purpose collections on Sundays, gifts directed for specific operating purposes, from weddings and valet parking. We then dip into our "Remembrance Fund" (described below) and our "Endowment Fund" (described below) to fill the gap as needed. Our # 1 goal is to work with our membership to reduce our dependence on these other funds so we can continue to operate and expand our ministries fully. Our annual "Stewardship Campaign" for annual operating pledges runs from November through January each year.

**Remembrance Fund** – This fund includes unrestricted gifts to the church (wills, trusts, estates), including contributions made in "remembrance" of others. These funds are used in support of the Operating account described above on an as-needed basis as approved by the current Elders who make up Session.

**Endowment Fund** – This is our long term fund. Historically these funds come from bequests from our congregation (wills, trusts, estates) that restrict the gifts for this purpose. We transfer a portion of these funds each year to help cover our full operating budget as needed, but we never take more than 5 % of the current balance. Many people view bequests as "perpetual pledges" to leave a legacy of continuing ministry.

**Capital Campaign** – The latest Capital Campaign was a 2016-2018 campaign to upgrade most of the church’s physical facilities – parking, Narthex, bathrooms, Center for Christian Studies Building, etc. A special campaign was put in place to raise \$3.5M and the project came in on time and on budget with completion in the first half of 2018. A few ancillary capital projects are being included in this account to top off the work needed at our beautiful facility, and we will continue to strive to maintain a small balance here for future capital needs.

**Debt** – Right now the Church has just \$125,000 of debt. This stems from the 3 year capital campaign project, and is expected to be paid off by the end of 2018 as final pledge payments come in toward the \$3.5M, which was fully pledged but not yet 100% collected. We are blessed as one of few congregations nationwide to have no meaningful debt and a fully upgraded set of facilities.

## I Don't Remember Me (Before You)

**READ:** Philippians 3:7 (Common English Bible)

*“These things were my assets, but I wrote them off as a loss for the sake of Christ.”*

### **REFLECT:**

TJ and John Osborne, brothers, grew up playing music together in Deale, Maryland. Following their move to Nashville they joined together as a vocal duo to become Brothers Osborne. Their most recent album, Port Saint Joe includes a rather nostalgic track, *I Don't Remember Me (Before You)*. Widely considered one of the deepest tracks on the album, the song speaks to the man who can't remember – or maybe doesn't want to remember – what his life was like before he met the love of his life: “I heard I was a wild one. I feel like a child, son. But I really don't recall.” And a few lines later, “I've seen pictures. And I've heard stories 'bout the boy I used to be. But I don't remember me.” The song is a bold declaration that once he fell in love with another he wanted to grow up and change his ways for the better. Now, looking back, he is unable to recognize the man he was before.

A similar tune plays in the Apostle Paul's letter to the Church in Philippi, the Book of Philippians. The letter is Paul's declaration of his love for Jesus Christ. Near the middle of this letter Paul recalls the man he used to be before Christ: a man of considerable stature in the Jewish faith, garnering wide respect from others for his faithful, and rigid, observance of the Jewish law – a Pharisee par excellence! More, Paul confesses to being somewhat of a braggart, “With respect to righteousness under the Law, I'm blameless.” (Verse 3:6b) Unlike the man in the Brothers Osborne track, Paul remembers his former self with great clarity. But then everything changed for Paul. He fell in love with Jesus. Now Paul looks back upon who he was before Jesus entered his life and determines that he was a foolish man – a man that valued the wrong things. What Paul once regarded as assets are now written off as a loss.

It is important for Paul to share with his readers his credentials before becoming a follower of Jesus. His resume sparkles and he dares anyone to present credentials that are more impressive. Paul doesn't embrace Jesus as someone who had nothing – or nothing to lose. Through the optics of what the world regards as of great value, Paul had it all. Paul had built an enviable life and reputation. Paul held “assets” that other people only dreamed of having. In possession of all anyone could have wanted Paul is invited into a relationship with Jesus. Now Paul has discovered the superior value of knowing Christ Jesus as Lord. What he once considered assets no longer has any value. Paul's point could not be clearer. The reader is in possession of nothing that is of more value than knowing Jesus.

Brothers Osborne song begins with the question, “Did I stop and watch the sunset fade? What gave me life and took my breath away?” These are questions that diminishes the value of a life lived before falling in love. TJ and John Osborne advance that very point later in the song, “Was my heart beatin' in my chest? Was I even alive?” Paul confesses to as much in his letter to the Church in Philippi, “In Christ I have a righteousness that is not my own and that does not come from the Law but rather from the faithfulness of Christ.” (Verse 3:9) Before Christ, all Paul thought he possessed had been simply an illusion. Now Paul sings another tune, “I've heard stories 'bout the boy I used to be. But that was before you, before you.”
