STATUS REPORT: Helmets of Hope @ 80 deliveries

On the occasion of our 80th supply delivery, which we made earlier today, and with thanks and praise to God, we offer a summary of the delivery side our ministry since our first deliveries in December 2015.

DELIVERIES: THE BASICS

- 80 deliveries
- 17,068 supply items (213 items/delivery)
- 445 move-in kits
- On average, a delivery every 16 days since December 2015

This is an exciting time in Helmets history. We've expanded our service area to 36 counties – one of which is on the Illinois-Indiana border – an expansion fueled by a higher level of engagement with the Salvation Army in Peoria and its new program offering short-term emergency housing to veterans. In addition, the first half of 2019 is now guaranteed to be the most active January-June delivery period in our history - nearly 2,900 supply items provided to our partners.

On the financial side, we've welcomed more money from more donors and donations in these first six months of 2019 than we did in all of 2018. And it's exciting to witness the emerging role our crafters are playing in our fundraising systems. That part of our team has a vision and is actively, creatively, and successfully pursuing its fulfillment.

We take little or no credit for these good things. God has blessed us mightily. Our role has been simply to accept the mission and be faithful to our calling. Because we have done so, today we celebrate 80 supply deliveries and a ministry the likes and impact of which none of us could have imagined when we first decided to provide household supplies to vets, just about four years ago now. Praise God!
