



This will be the last article on Grief for a few months, while I am on leave participating in a training program. For this last article, I would like to share a few things people have shared that they wish they had known about grief. (1) Take care of yourself, even when you don't feel like it. (2) Grief comes in waves - you may feel better one hour, but not the next, or one month and not the next. This is normal. (3) Even though being busy can be helpful, if you use busyness to avoid the grief, it just prolongs it. (4) It is okay to cry when you need to, and it is also okay to laugh - don't feel guilty for either one. (5) When people offer help, accept it. It's okay to need people. (6) God is there for you. You can throw your emotions at God - all of them, you can scream, cry and question, and God remains near. Nothing can separate you from the love of God.


