Chapter 1: Greetings and _____

Galatians 1:6-7 (NIV) “I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you to live in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— which is really no gospel at all. Evidently some people are throwing you into confusion and are trying to pervert the gospel of Christ.”

Chapter 2: Paul’s Unity with The _____

Galatians 2:21 (NLT) “I do not treat the grace of God as meaningless. For if keeping the law could make us right with God, then there was no need for Christ to die.”

Chapter 3: _____ vs. Works of the Law

Galatians 3:2 (NLT) “Let me ask you this one question: Did you receive the Holy Spirit by obeying the law of Moses? Of course not! You received the Spirit because you believed the message you heard about Christ.”

Galatians 3:21b-22 (NLT) “If the law could give us new life, we could be made right with God by obeying it. But the Scriptures declare that we are all prisoners of sin, so we receive God’s promise of freedom only by believing in Jesus Christ.”

Chapter 4: _____ & Heirs Through Christ

Galatians 4:4-7 (NIV) “But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. Because you are his sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, ‘Abba, Father.’ So you are no longer a slave, but God’s child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir.”

Chapter 5: _____ in Christ

Galatians 5:1 & 13 (NIV) “It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery... You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love.”

Life in the _____ vs. Life in the Spirit.

Galatians 5:19-23 (NIV) “The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.”

Chapter 6: Don’t look _____ -- Press forward in Christ!

Galatians 6:18 (NIV) “The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen.”

1. Read Gal. 1:6-7. Google the definition of the word REBUKE. Why does Paul “rebuken” the Galatians in these verses? What is wrong with what the Galatians are doing?
2. What important truth(s) do we learn from Gal. 2:21?
3. Read Gal. 3:21b-22. How does the gospel bring “freedom” -- Describe the nature of this freedom. What are we “freed from” and what are we “freed to” (i.e. what does our freedom in Christ call us into)?
4. Read Gal. 5:19-23. Share your impressions.
5. Read Gal. Chapter 6. How does this chapter help us know how to live out the freedom we have in Christ?
