TALK IT OVER

1. Read Jude 3. How do we practically "contend for the faith" in our daily lives, and what are some specific challenges we might face in doing so?
2. Read Jude 4. In what ways have you seen the perversion of God's grace (sometimes called "cheap grace") lead to a lackadaisical attitude toward sin and the holiness and lordship of Jesus? How can we guard ourselves against falling into this trap?
3. Read Jude 5-7. Reflecting on the examples of Israel, rebellious angels, Sodom, and Gomorrah, how can we ensure that we do not follow their example of choosing darkness over God's truth in our lives?
4. Read Jude 17-19. As the day of the Lord's return approaches, how can we strengthen our faith and resist the influence of scoffers who follow their ungodly desires?
5. Read Jude 22-23. Discuss ways in which we can balance showing mercy and love to those who doubt or are trapped in sin, while also maintaining a sense of reverence and caution in upholding the truth of God's Word.
