

TALK IT OVER

- 1. Read Revelation 5:4-5. John weeps because no one is found worthy to open the scroll. How have you personally felt when faced with seemingly insurmountable challenges or unanswered questions--about the brokenness and evil of this world? How does the eventual appearance of Jesus as the worthy one encourage you to trust in God's timing and sovereignty?
- 2. Read Revelation 5:5-6. How does this imagery of a conquering Lamb who was sacrificed encourage us in times of persecution and suffering?
- 3. Read Revelation 5:8. How does this passage illustrate the connection between the prayers of God's people and the unfolding of God's plan for judgment and redemption? How should this knowledge influence our prayer life?
- 4. Read Revelation 5:9-10. What does this song of praise reveal about the significance of Jesus' worthiness to open the seals and execute God's judgment? How can this inspire our worship today?
- 5. Read Revelation 5:11-14. How does this scene emphasize the universal recognition of Jesus' sovereignty? How does knowing that all of creation worships Him impact our perspective on His lordship?
