TALK IT OVER

- 1) Read Revelation 10. In this chapter of Revelation, the angel holds a scroll that is both sweet and bitter. How does this symbolism relate to our experience of receiving and sharing God's Word in our world?
- 2) John is called to "prophesy again" in Revelation 10:11. What does it mean for us to prophesy in today's context, and how can we faithfully proclaim God's message in the midst of an unbelieving world? What challenges or obstacles might we face?
- 3) The angel's stance in Revelation 10 signifies God's sovereignty over creation. How does recognizing God's sovereignty impact our faith and our willingness to carry out His mission in the world—even when circumstances seem difficult?
- **4)** In Revelation 10:9, the angel instructs John to "eat" the little scroll. How does this illustrate the way we receive nourishment and strength from God's Word?
- 5) Discuss how receiving God's Word can be sweet and how sharing it, especially in the context of unbeliever, can be "sour". How can we as a church family help each other to remain faithful to continually feed upon, and proclaim God's Word?
