TALK IT OVER

- 1.** In Revelation 11, the two witnesses are proclaimers of God's Truth (light in the darkness). How can Christians today, embody this role in our communities, workplaces, and families?
- 2.** The 42 months and 1,260 days mentioned in Revelation 11:2-3 are symbols of finite, passing periods of time. How can this symbolism provide hope and encouragement to believers facing challenges and persecution?
- 3.** The two witnesses have power to shut up the heavens, turn waters into blood, and bring plagues. How does this display of power relate to the broader theme of God's power working through His servants throughout history? What might this mean for us today?
- 4.** The reaction of the world to the “silencing” of two witnesses is one of celebration. How does this reflect the historical and current response of the world to the proclamation of God's truth? How can we prepare for and respond to such opposition?
- 5.** Revelation 11:13 ends with the survivors of the earthquake “terrified” and “giving glory to God in heaven” -- but there is no mention of repentance from sin or faith in Christ. Have you experienced the world “acknowledging God” in this unrepentant way? How can we best witness to people like this?
