

**TALK IT OVER**

- 1.** Read Revelation 17. Pause as you read to note each place the prostitute of Babylon represents a spirit of seduction and worldly culture?
- 2.** Revelation 17:3, describes the prostitute as riding on the back of the scarlet beast (Fleshly seduction always piggybacks on worldly culture) How do we see our worldly culture today seducing people away from God?
- 3.** Revelation 17:5 mentions the name written on the woman's forehead. How might this name reflect the mindset of worldliness, and how should Christians guard against adopting it?
- 4.** Revelation 17:16 talks about the beast and the ten horns turning against the prostitute. How does this relate to the rise and fall of worldly powers and spirits of Babylon?
- 5.** Based on Revelation 17, how can we practically apply the call to not love the world or conform to its pattern while fixing our eyes on Jesus as our Lord and Savior in today's culture?
