TALK IT OVER

- **1.** Ever felt alone, afraid, or uncertain like Hagar? How did you respond to those situations? (Genesis 16:6-10)
- **2.** What thoughts does the question "Where have you come from, where are you going?" evoke within you? Why is it important for us to consider this question in our lives?
- **3.** Read Psalm 139:13. What does this passage reveal about "Where we come from?" Why is this truth important to know in times of crisis?
- **4.** Read John 3:16. Hagar was at a crossroads of crisis. God's question to her reminded her that she was not abandoned—that He saw her, knew her, loved her, and had a future for her. How does John 3:16 remind us of these same powerful truths?
- **5.** Reflecting on 1 Corinthians 2:9, how does the promise of an unimaginably glorious future in Christ influence your perspective on life's journey and uncertainties?
