Genesis 32:24 (NIV) "So Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him till daybreak."

Genesis 32:25 (NIV) "When the man saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man."

Genesis 32:26 (NIV) "Then the man said, 'Let me go, for it is daybreak.' But Jacob replied, 'I will not let you go unless you bless me.'"

2 Corinthians 4:16-18 (NIV, 84) "Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

Genesis 32:27 (NIV) "The man asked him, 'What is your name?' 'Jacob," he answered."

Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV) "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast."

Genesis 32:28 (NIV) "Then the man said, 'Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with humans and have overcome."

TALK IT OVER

- **1.** In Genesis 32, we see Jacob wrestling with God throughout the night. How do you relate to the idea of wrestling with God in your own faith journey? Have there been moments when you've struggled with surrendering control to God?
- **2.** Jacob's name means "Deceiver" or "Grabber." How has your past or upbringing influenced your understanding of your identity, and how has it shaped your relationship with God?
- **3.** Jacob's desperate desire for his father's blessing played a significant role in his actions. How do you think the pursuit of affirmation, acceptance, or blessing from earthly figures has impacted your own life and decisions?
- **4.** God changed Jacob's name to Israel, signifying a transformation from striving against God to overcoming through surrender and faith. In what ways have you experienced transformation in your own life through surrender and faith in God?
- **5.** Reflecting on Jacob's confession of his name, how comfortable are you with acknowledging and confessing your own struggles, weaknesses, and identity before God? What might be holding you back from complete transparency with God in your prayers and confession?
