Church Potluck– Today


Everyone is invited to a potluck **today, immediately following service (11:30 am), in the Family Life Center (Gym).**

God Question Part 6 Is It Right For You To Be Angry?

Jonah 4:1-4 (NIV) “But to Jonah this seemed very wrong, and he became angry. He prayed to the Lord, ‘Isn’t this what I said, Lord, when I was still at home? That is what I tried to forestall by fleeing to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. Now, Lord, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live.’ But the Lord replied, ‘Is it right for you to be angry?’”

Matthew 7:3-5 (NIV) “Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother’s eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother’s eye.”

Isaiah 55:8-9 (NIV) “For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways,’ declares the Lord. ‘As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.’”

Lamentations 3:22-23 (NIV) “Because of the Lord’s great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.”

Romans 5:8 (NIV) “But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.”

John 3:16 (NIV) “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.”

TALK IT OVER

1. Read Jonah 4:1-4. How did Jonah's feelings towards the Ninevites impact his willingness to deliver God's message of repentance? Can you relate? Explain.
2. How does Jonah's anger reveal his failure to understand our need for God's compassion and mercy?
3. Reflecting on Matthew 7:3-5, how can we avoid falling into the same judgmental mindset as Jonah when facing hurt or mistreatment?
4. Consider the significance of Jonah's lack of self-examination and how it hindered his ability to celebrate God’s mercy to the Ninevites.
