#1. Atonement _____ You to God

Romans 5:8 (NIV) “But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.”

#2. Atonement Brings _____ and a Clean Conscience

Romans 5:1 (NIV) “Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

#3. Atonement Opens God’s _____ to You

Hebrews 4:15-16 (NIV) “For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.”

#4. Atonement _____ Us to Live for Christ

2 Corinthians 5:15 (NIV) “And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.”

TALK IT OVER

- 1.** (Romans 5:8) How does knowing you were reconciled to God before you "cleaned up your life" impact how you view yourself—and how you treat others who seem far from God?
- 2.** (Romans 5:1) True peace comes not from circumstances, but from being right with God. In what areas of your life do you still struggle with guilt or restlessness, and how can the truth of atonement bring you deeper peace and freedom?
- 3.** (2 Corinthians 5:15) We are called not just to be(eve, but to live for the One who died for us. What’s one practical way you can respond to the love of Christ this week—not out of obligation, but out of gratitude?
