TALK IT OVER

- **1.** In 1 Corinthians 15:33, Paul warns that "Bad company corrupts good character." Looking back at your own life, can you think of a time when the people around you influenced you toward either spiritual growth or spiritual compromise? What made the difference between those two outcomes?
- 2. Jesus loved everyone but also set clear relational boundaries—even with close friends like Peter (Matthew 16:23). What practical steps can we take to love people well while also protecting our hearts and minds from toxic influences?
- **3.** The sermon described three kinds of toxic people: the Complainer, the Controller, and the Corrupter. Which of these do you find hardest to deal with, and why? How can we respond to such people in a way that honors God and maintains our integrity?
