Romans 3:20-22 (NIV, 84) "Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. **Luke 18:13-14a (NIV)** "But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' 14 'I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God.'"

#### **TALK IT OVER**

- **1.** Religion vs. Relationship--How have you personally experienced the difference between trying to "earn" God's approval through religious effort and living out of the freedom of a relationship with Jesus?
- **2.** External vs. Internal--Jesus warned against focusing on outward appearances while neglecting the heart (Matthew 23:25). In what ways do you see "external-focused" religion show up in the church today, and how can we help each other live from the inside out?
- **3.** Pride vs. Humility--The Pharisee compared himself to others, while the tax collector simply cried for mercy (Luke 18:9–14). Why do you think spiritual pride is so dangerous? How can humility shape our testimony so that it points people to the pure gospel rather than to ourselves?
