Luke 23:39-41 (NIV) "One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: 'Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' 40 But the other criminal rebuked him. 'Don't you fear God,' he said, 'since you are under the same sentence? 41 We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong.'"

We are all of those two thieves.
Thief #1:
<b>Luke 23:39 (NIV)</b> "One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: 'Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' "Messiah"
Thief #2:
<b>Luke 23:40-42 (NIV)</b> "But the other criminal rebuked him. 'Don't you fear God,' he said, 'since you are under the same sentence? 41 We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'"
BOTH Thieves Deserved
But Jesus gave thief #2!

**Luke 23:43 (NIV)** "Jesus answered him, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise.'"

**John 3:16 (NIV)** "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

**Romans 6:23 (NIV)** "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

**1 Peter 1:3 (NIV)** "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

#### **TALK IT OVER**

- 1. Both criminals deserved death, yet they responded to Jesus in very different ways. When you reflect on your own heart, do you sometimes respond more like the unrepentant thief (wanting escape without surrender), or the repentant thief (admitting guilt and trusting Jesus)? Why?
- 2. Scripture reminds us that "the wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23). How does honestly facing what we deserve (spiritual death) deepen our gratitude for the gift of life through Christ?
- 3. The repentant thief received grace at his lowest moment—not because he earned it, but because he humbled himself before Jesus. How can remembering that truth shape the way we live daily—in how we view ourselves, how we worship, and how we extend grace to others?
