Easton Perkins

I grew up in Alexandria, Kentucky and attended Plum Creek Christian Church since before I can remember. My dad has been on staff at Plum Creek my whole life. He and my older brother, who also decided to major in Preaching and Church Leadership, both explained and lived out how important preaching the gospel was.
